ORDINANCE NO. 2022 – 004

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR TO ISSUE AND APPROVE CHANGE ORDER NO. 1 (FINAL) FOR AN INCREASE IN THE CONTRACT PRICE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE AND FABRIZI TRUCKING & PAVING COMPANY, INC., IN CONNECTION WITH THE WEST 130TH AND SPRAGUE ROAD PUMP STATION REPLACEMENT PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 2019-165, Council authorized the Mayor to enter into a contract with Fabrizi Trucking & Paving Company, Inc. for replacement of a pump station in the City of Strongsville, in connection with the West 130th and Sprague Road Pump Station Replacement Project (the "Project"), in an amount not to exceed \$365,956.00; and

WHEREAS, the City's Engineer has now recommended that it would be in the best interests of the City to include changes in the work performed or to be performed on the Project by Fabrizi Trucking & Paving Company, Inc., generally being reconciliation of plan quantities to actual field quantities, and additional work required and requested by the City, all as more fully set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully rewritten, and to provide additional payment for such changes in the work in the amount of \$9,755.13 for a new total Project cost of \$375,711.13.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Mayor be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue and approve Change Order No. 1 (Final) to the contract in the amount of \$9,755.13, as recommended by the City Engineer, and reflected in Exhibit A; and after the issuance and approval of said Change Order No. 1 (Final) and completion of such work, to direct the Director of Finance to make payment to **FABRIZI TRUCKING & PAVING COMPANY, INC.**, in the additional amount of \$9,755.13, thereby increasing the total contract and Project cost to \$375,711.13.

Section 2. That the funds necessary for this Ordinance have been appropriated and shall be paid from the Sanitary Sewer Fund; and that the Director of Finance be and is hereby authorized and directed to issue the City's warrants for payment accordingly, and in accordance with the terms and conditions of the contract.

Section 3. AN ORDINANCE REQUESTING THE COOPERATION OF THE COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, OHIO, AND CONSENTING TO THE REPLACEMENT OF THE WEST 130TH STREET BRIDGE 02.26 OVER THE EAST BRANCH OF THE ROCKY RIVER IN THE CITIES OF NORTH ROYALTON AND STRONGSVILLE, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City has recognized the need for and proposes the improvement of a portion of public highway which is described as follows:

The replacement of West 130th Street Bridge 02.26 over the East Branch of the Rocky River in the Cities of North Royalton and Strongsville.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION A. (Consent)

That it is declared to be in the public interest that the consent of said City of Strongsville be and such consent is hereby given to Cuyahoga County to participate in the cost of construction of the above-described improvement.

SECTION B. (Cooperation)

1. That the City will cooperate with the County in the replacement of West 130th Street Bridge 02.26 over the East Branch of the Rocky River in the Cities of North Royalton and Strongsville.

2. That the County will arrange for the preparation of construction plans and specifications, including necessary engineering reports for improvement, under current Cuyahoga County standards for construction of County roads and bridges.

3. That the County will arrange for the supervision and administration of the construction contract.

SECTION C. (Funding)

1. That the City hereby agrees to participate with the County in the cost of the improvement by an allocation from the County Motor Vehicle License Tax Fund to pay the County portion of the project.

SECTION D. (Maintenance)

That upon completion of said improvement, the City will thereafter keep said highway open to traffic at all times, and

1. Maintain the improvement in accordance with the provisions of the statutes relating thereto and make ample financial provisions for such maintenance;

2. Maintain the right-of-way and keep it free of obstructions in a manner satisfactory to the County, and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes and permit no signs, posters, billboards, roadside stands or other private installations within the right-of-way limits;

3. That the County shall continue to maintain the structural elements of any bridge (defined as a structure with a span of twenty feet or greater) located within the limits of the improvement in accordance with the applicable sections of the Ohio Revised Code; and

4. After construction of the project is complete, the City agrees to follow and maintain post-construction Best Management Practices as outlined in the City's Storm Water Permit that is filed with the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (O.E.P.A.).

SECTION E. (Traffic)

That upon completion of said improvement the City will thereafter keep said highway open to traffic at all times; and

1. Place and maintain all traffic control devices conforming to the Ohio Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices on the improvement in compliance with the provisions of Section 4511.11 and related sections of the Ohio Revised Code;

2. The street or highway shall be and hereby is designated a through highway as provided in Section 4511.07(A)(6) of the Ohio Revised Code;

3. Stop signs affecting the movement of traffic on said street or highway within the roadway being improved shall be removed, and no stop signs shall be erected on same except at its intersection with another through highway where traffic does not warrant the installation of a traffic control signal but where the warrants for a "four-way stop" as provided in the aforesaid Manual are met;

4. No rule or regulation shall be enacted restricting the use of the improved road and/or structure by any class of vehicle or vehicle load permitted by the Ohio Revised Code to use a public highway. Any existing rule or regulation so restricting road usage shall be rescinded; and

5. The City shall regulate parking by prohibiting parking in accordance with Section 4511.66 of the Ohio Revised Code, unless otherwise controlled by local ordinance or resolution.

SECTION F. (Right-of-Way)

1. That all existing street and public right-of-way within the City which is necessary for the aforesaid improvement, if any, shall be made available therefore.

2. That in the event any additional right-of-way is required, the City will arrange for the acquisition.

SECTION G. (Utilities)

1. That the County will make arrangements with and obtain agreements from all privately-owned public utility companies whose lines or structures will be affected by the said improvement, and said companies have agreed to make any and all necessary arrangements in such a manner as to be clear of any construction called for by the plans of said improvement, and said companies have agreed to make such necessary arrangements immediately after notification by the City.

2. That the County will pay the cost of alterations of governmentally-owned utility facilities which come within the provisions of Section 8301 (Utility Reimbursement Eligibility) of the Ohio Department of Transportation's Real Estate Policies and Procedures Manual to the same extent that it participates in the other costs of the project, provided, however, that such participation will not extend to any additions or betterments of existing facilities.

3. That the City shall cooperate with the County to make all arrangements of governmentally-owned utilities and/or appurtenances thereto which do not comply with the provisions of Section 8301 (Utility Reimbursement Eligibility) of the Ohio Department of Transportation's Real Estate Policies and Procedures Manual, whether inside or outside the corporate limits, as may be necessary to conform to said improvement.

4. That the construction, reconstruction, and/or rearrangement of all utilities shall be done in such a manner as not to interfere unduly with the operation of the contractor constructing the improvement; and all backfilling of trenches made necessary by such utility rearrangements shall be performed in accordance with the provisions of the Ohio Department of Transportation Construction and Material Specifications.

SECTION H. (Miscellaneous)

1. That if the County is formally requested by City Resolution to include the construction of sanitary sewers, waterlines, area sewers (drainage or area surrounding the improvement), sidewalks, alternate bid items, or other items in the improvement that are in addition to those now existing and not provided for elsewhere in this Ordinance and the agreement, the County will do so, provided that this construction meets with the approval of the County and the City involved in this improvement; and that the City agrees to pay, or make arrangements for the payment of, the cost of said additional construction and the cost of preliminary and design engineering, and construction supervision.

2. That the City shall be solely responsible for the certifications or obligations made or agreed to in Sections F-1, F-2, G-1, G-3 and G-4 and hereby agrees that the County shall be and is hereby released from any and all damages or claims of the City arising from or growing out of the certifications or obligations made or agreed to in Sections F-1, F-2, G-1, G-3 and G-4 hereinabove.

3. For the purpose of this Ordinance and the Agreement, the agent for the County and liaison officer on the matter contained herein shall be the County Engineer of Cuyahoga County, Ohio, and/or such members of his staff as he may designate.

4. By enacting this Ordinance and entering into the Agreement, the City agrees to conduct this transaction by electronic means and agrees that all documents requiring County signatures may be executed by electronic means, and that the electronic signatures affixed by

the County to said documents shall have the same legal effect as if that signature was manually affixed to a paper version of the document. The City also agrees on behalf of the aforementioned entities and persons to be bound by the provisions of Chapters 304 and 1306 of the Ohio Revised Code as they pertain to electronic transactions, and to comply with the electronic signature policy of the County.

SECTION I. (Authority to Sign)

1. That the Mayor of the City is hereby empowered and directed on behalf of the City to enter into agreements with the County necessary to complete the planning and construction of this improvement.

2. That the Mayor of the City is hereby empowered and directed on behalf of the City to make application to the County of Cuyahoga, Ohio for approval to use County Motor Vehicle License Tax Funds for the improvement.

SECTION J.

That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION K.

That this Ordinance is hereby declared an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City, and for the further reasons that it is necessary to enter into such consent and cooperation agreement in order for the improvement to proceed, to promote highway safety, to avoid delays in traffic and inconvenience to the traveling public, and to conserve public funds. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE REPLACEMENT AND INSTALLATION OF THE MISSION COMMUNICATIONS NOTIFICATION SYSTEM EQUIPMENT AND APPURTENANCES AT THE CITY'S WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANTS AND SANITARY LIFT STATIONS, IN ORDER TO UPGRADE THE CELLULAR-BASED ALARM SYSTEM, WITHOUT PUBLIC BIDDING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, in order to continue operating the City's Wastewater Treatment plants and sanitary lift stations property and efficiently, the Department of Public Service must upgrade certain integral equipment; and

WHEREAS, such Mission Communications equipment is a cellular-based alarm system currently operating on a 3-G network, which notifies the pertinent City officials when, for instance, there are high water/high flow issues at the wastewater and sanitary lift station facilities; and

WHEREAS, this cellular-based alarm system must be upgrade d now in order to continue to work properly with other existing equipment; and

WHEREAS, therefore, the Director of Public Service, together with Veolia North America (formerly American Water), the City's operator of its wastewater facilities and sanitary lift stations, has recommended that it is immediately necessary to contract for the replacement of the obsolete notification equipment and installation of upgraded Mission Communication equipment, in order to protect the health, safety, welfare and property of the City, its employees and agents; and
