AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE ADOPTED BY SECTION 1250.03 OF TITLE SIX, PART TWELVE OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF STRONGSVILLE TO CHANGE THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF CERTAIN VACANT LAND AND REAL ESTATE LOCATED NEAR ROYALTON ROAD AND PROSPECT ROAD IN THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE FROM R1-75 (ONE FAMILY 75) CLASSIFICATION TO LB (LOCAL BUSINESS) CLASSIFICATION (PART OF PPN 393-15-028), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the owner of certain vacant land located near Royalton Road and Prospect Road, being part of Permanent Parcel No. 393-15-028, has submitted a petition to the City requesting rezoning of a portion of their property from R1-75 (One Family 75) classification to LB (Local Business) classification; and

WHEREAS, Article VIII, Section 6 of the City Charter provides that neither the Council, the Mayor, any Board, including Board of Appeals, or Commission appointed pursuant to this Charter, or any ordinance or resolution of this Municipality, nor any other agent, employee, person or organization acting for or on behalf of this Municipality, by whatever authority or purported authority, shall by ordinance, resolution, motion, proclamation, statement, legislative or administrative action, or variance effect a change in the zoning classification or district of any property or area in the City of Strongsville from R1-75 (One Family 75) or R1-100 (One Family 100) commonly known as single family residential, or by whatever other name called, to any other zoning classification or district unless the change or grant, after adoption in accordance with applicable administrative and/or legislative procedures, is approved at a regularly scheduled election by a majority vote of the electors voting thereon, in the City of Strongsville and in each ward in which the change is applicable to property in the ward.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Zoning Map of the City of Strongsville, adopted by Section 1250.03 of Title Six, Part Twelve of the Codified Ordinances of Strongsville, be amended to change the zoning classification of certain vacant land and property located near Royalton Road and Prospect Road from R1-75 (One Family 75) classification to LB (Local Business) classification, which property is more fully described in Exhibit "A" and is depicted in Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference; and provided that such amendments are approved at a regularly scheduled election by a majority vote of the electors voting thereon in the City of Strongsville and in each ward in which the changes are applicable to the property in the ward.

Section 2. That, after approval by the electors as set forth in Section 1 above, the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized to cause the necessary changes on the Zoning Map to be made in order to reflect the zoning changes in classification as provided in this Ordinance.

Section 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to rezone such property in order to meet the deadline for submittal of this issue to the ballot in accordance with law, to provide for the orderly development of lots and lands within the City, and to enhance economic development within the City. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.



IN CONNECTION WITH THE WHITNEY ROAD COVERED BRIDGE PROJECT (CUY-WHITNEY ROAD BRIDGE; PID NO. 111574), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 2023-002, Council authorized the Mayor to enter into a contract with CT Consultants, Inc. for professional construction management services for the Whitney Road Covered Bridge Project (Cuy-Whitney Road Bridge; PID No. 111574 (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, due to the fact that this is a federally funded project, it was required by the Ohio Department of Transportation that a construction manager be hired and that a representative of the construction manager be onsite at all times during construction; and

WHEREAS, CT Consultants, Inc. has provided the level of effort and manpower necessary to manage the project through unforeseen situations and circumstances beyond their control, including unplanned coordination with the design engineers, answering an increased number of Requests for Information (RFI's), and an increase to project staffing to accommodate a work week increased from 40 hours to 48 including weekends; and

WHEREAS, therefore, the City's Engineer has now recommended that it would be in the City's best interests to include modifications to the scope and cost of the professional construction management services proposal by CT Consultants, Inc., all as more fully set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein as if fully rewritten, and to provide additional payment for such modifications to the contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

- **Section 1.** That the Mayor be and is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a modification to the professional construction management services contract, as recommended by the City Engineer and requested by the City, reflected in Exhibit A, and to direct the Director of Finance to make payment to **CT CONSULTANTS**, **INC.** in the additional amount of \$50,000.00, thereby increasing the total contract cost to \$252,074.00.
- **Section 2.** That the funds necessary for this Ordinance have been appropriated and shall be paid from the General Capital Improvement Fund and any other Federal, State or local funds which are available for this purpose.
- **Section 3.** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to provide for modifications to the project and cost proposal for construction management services, to facilitate payment to the consultant for unforeseen circumstances, to avoid potential legal problems, and conserve public funds. Dear Mr. Mikula,

We have reached a point in the project where we have been able to assess the impacts on our work due to plan inconsistencies, contractor schedule changes, delays, and requests for additional time. Our assessment indicates that over the last 2-months we have had to expend significant resources and time to address the aforementioned items, and that it has adversely affected our authorized project budget. Currently, funds do not remain for our work in the near nor intermediate terms, and a shortfall is at hand. Absent any further disruptions in the work, this shortfall is anticipated to be approximately \$50,000 provided work concludes and the contract is closed out in October 2024. Circumstances relevant to the matter are presented below for your further consideration.

A leading indicator of the level of effort required for construction services is the cost of construction. For this project the opinion of cost furnished and utilized as part of the level of service determination was \$1,800,795. As you are aware the actual bid amount subsequent to a rebid was \$2,420,245, over 34% higher. While such is not a reason for a fee revision for construction services, it suggested that a higher level of administration and inspection effort would be required commensurate with the higher workload anticipated by the contractor as evidenced by their bid.

The higher level of effort noted has over the last 2-months manifested itself in several ways:

- Significant plan discrepancies requiring unplanned coordination with design engineers;
- Increased number of RFI's from the Contractor regarding above plan issues;
- Contractor increased project staffing from forty hours per week to forty-eight or more;
- Subcontractors have performed their scope of work on weekends.

Each of these items required inspection and administrative staff to apply efforts in excess of that provided in our original scope of work and fee.

In addition to the above, situations were encountered that also required additional administrative and inspection time including but not limited to:

- Incorrect rebar sizing on the bridge deck curbing, causing a project wide shut-down and delay on the critical path;
- Insufficient rebar for the deck itself, again causing a delay on the critical path;
- Inconsistent details in the drawings regarding attachment of the glulam arches to the bridge mounting brackets. Such is current and is negatively affecting the critical path.

Looking forward it is currently anticipated that inspection needs can be trimmed from the levels required over the prior months with the administration work winding down towards the end of September of this year. The administrative work is anticipated to conclude within a month after the contractor has finished their work.

Attached please find a copy of our original agreement including our proposed breakdown of hours and tasks. Also is a breakdown of hours utilized by key staff from the genesis of the project through 7/26/24.

Finally, attached is a spreadsheet broken down by month with our prognostications for each key staff member's anticipated time on the project from now until project conclusion including a projection of costs and the anticipated shortfall.

As this is being written the prime contractor has been proceeding with work not on the critical path with the anticipation that time lost to other issues can be partially made up. As the noted work is mostly cosmetic in nature, we have taken steps to minimize the cost overruns we are experiencing, i.e., reassigning personnel and inspection frequency.

We have and will continue to economize where and whenever possible without effecting the needed and expected work product, but unfortunately our efforts will not be able to cover all the costs incurred that are associated with the expanded work scope. Given the present level of effort, we have reached the limit of our authorization and respectfully request to modify our fees by an additional \$50,000 to cover the remaining work.







Dear Mr. Jamison:

Enclosed is the ms consultants' modification request for additional construction-related services for the improvements to 'B' Plant, 'C' Plant and the Westwood Lift Station. As you are aware, the project scope increased considerably due to the condition of the facilities, code requirements and safety improvements needed at all three locations. Explanation for the additional scope of services was provided within Modification Request #1. The construction value of the proposed improvements is approximately six times greater than originally anticipated when the Request for Qualifications was issued and the design and estimated construction durations have increased as well.

In July of 2023, Modification No. 1 was processed to adjust the contract for design services only based on the additional scope of work performed. This modification No. 2 covers the additional scope of services requested for Construction Administration (CA) and Resident Project Representative (RPR) services.

The Scope of Services in the original Engineering Agreement anticipated providing CA and RPR services for a single construction contract with an estimated duration of 14 months. RPR services were anticipated to be six (6) months at 40-hours per week and eight (8) months at 20 hours per week. Bidding, CA and RPR services were specifically excluded for the Early Blower Package.

During the development of the project, CA services were requested to be performed for the Early Blower Package, which was completed in September 2022, and the Westwood Lift Station Improvements were bid as a separate contract form the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements. The Westwood Lift Station is currently under construction, and CA services are being performed. Given the increased scope of the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements, the construction duration is expected to be approximately 24 months. This project will be advertised for bids beginning in August or September 2024.

The additional scope of services related to construction includes:

- 1. Construction administration requested by the City for the Early Blower Package. These services were excluded from the original scope and fee.
 - a. CA services performed during period from June 2021 through September 2022.
 - b. 285 manhours expended for CA
- 2. Construction administration is being performed for separate Westwood contract.
 - a. Services began January 2023 and final completion is expected October 2024.
 - b. 212 manhours expended to date (through July 15, 2024).
- 3. Scope of the Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements increased, causing the anticipated construction duration to increase.
 - a. Full time RPR was requested by the City.
 - b. Expected duration for CA services is 24 months.
 - c. Expected duration for RPR services is 20 months.

The additional scope items are attached for your review in Exhibit A-2. The following is a summary of the modification request, further described in Exhibit B-2:

MODIFICATION #2 ADDITIONAL SCOPE OF WORK FOR CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION/INSPECTION

Understanding

The City of Strongsville solicited engineering design and consulting services for the rehabilitation of two (2) wastewater treatment plants (WWTP), and the Westwood Lift Station. The services included preliminary design, detail design, bidding, construction administration and construction inspection. The two WWTPs, known as WWTPs B and C, were expanded in 1984-85 and have nearly identical treatment processes. WWTP B has an average design flow (ADF) of 2.1 MGD and is gravity fed. WWTP C has an ADF of 1.8 MGD and has an influent lift station. The Westwood Lift Station has a peak flow capacity of 9.4 MGD and was built around 1970. All three of these facilities are contract operated by Veolia (Operator).

Both of the plants are similar with each having four (4) rectangular primary clarifiers with preaeration basins, Rotating Biological Contactors (RBCs) for secondary treatment, four (4) rectangular secondary clarifiers, and four (4) Parkson DynaSand Filters.

The original scope and fee anticipated the completion of an early blower package (excluding bidding and construction services), and a final design package for both plants and the Westwood Lift Station, with a total anticipated construction cost of approximately \$7 million with a total construction duration of approximately 14 months. During preliminary design and the condition assessments at all facilities, the scope of the project was increased due, primarily, to age and condition of the infrastructure, flooding concerns, necessity to meet current building and National Fire Protection codes, and the need for additional safety improvements at all three facilities. The construction cost estimate for the improvements increased to approximately \$40 million spread between three separate projects:

- 1. 'C' Plant Blower and Washer Compactor Replacement
- 2. Westwood Lift Station Improvements
- 3. Wastewater Treatment Plants 'B' and 'C' Improvements

The anticipated construction schedule also increased considerably from the original estimated 14 total months. Contract Modification #1 included budget modification for additional design tasks only. Modification #2 is for budget modification due to increase in requested services during construction, as well as increased construction duration and administration of multiple bid packages. The following is a summary of additional tasks performed or to be performed:

Additional Tasks under F1 (Construction Administration) and G1 (Resident Project Representative):

Early Blower Package

1. Construction Administration requested/performed for Early Blower Package (excluded from original scope of work)

Westwood Lift Station (Separate Bid Package)

- 1. Separate Construction Administration of Westwood Lift Station with increased scope of services extending construction duration:
 - a. Replacement of pumps and mechanical (HVAC) improvements (excluded from original scope of work)
 - b. Replacement of comminutor (excluded from original scope of work)
 - c. Structural and architectural design of new outside access to wet well (required enclosure, ventilation and drainage)
 - d. Site improvements and generator relocation

'B' Plant & 'C' Plant

- 1. Longer anticipated construction duration due to increased scope of project.
- 2. Estimated Construction Administration to be provided for a period not to exceed twenty-four months with 22 hours per week of construction administration (construction administrator and administrative assistant).
- 3. Estimated Resident Project Representative full-time for a period not-to-exceed twenty months with 50 hours per week of RPR services.

AN ORDINANCE RATIFYING AND APPROVING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM THE OHIO ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE IN CONNECTION WITH THEIR LAW ENFORCEMENT DIVERSION PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 2025 RELATING TO THE OPIOID EPIDEMIC; AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, by and through Ordinance No. 2017-159, this Council approved and authorized the filing of an application for financial assistance from the Ohio Attorney General's Office in connection with their Law Enforcement Diversion Program relating to the opioid epidemic, so that the City could proceed to form and implement a Quick Response/Drug Abuse Response Team to directly assist individuals affected by the opioid crisis, and provide such individuals and families with outreach from the City of Strongsville Police and Fire Emergency Services; and

WHEREAS, by and through subsequent Ordinance Nos. 2017-178, 2019-144, 2020-071, 2021-127, 2022-081 and 2023-119, this Council approved the filing of additional applications and acceptance of awards of funding from the Ohio Attorney General's Office and further authorized the Mayor to enter into Agreements in connection therewith; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Attorney General's Office has once again extended the opportunity for law enforcement agencies to apply for funds through the Law Enforcement Diversion Program for the fiscal year 2025; and

WHEREAS, in order to meet the deadline for submission of applications to receive funding under the Ohio Attorney General's Office Law Enforcement Diversion Program for the fiscal year 2025, the City, through its Police Department, has applied for further funding to continue the Drug Abuse Response Team program; and

WHEREAS, the City has been notified that its application for the reimbursement of certain funds expended under the Ohio Attorney General's Office Law Enforcement Diversion Program has been approved in the amount of \$65,000.00; and

WHEREAS, therefore, the City is now desirous of accepting such award.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Recipient Organization: Strongsville Police Department

The parties hereto agree as follows:

- In accordance with the terms hereof, the Recipient Organization (the "Recipient") agrees to expend certain funds for the Law Enforcement Diversion Program to address the opioid epidemic in Ohio by providing necessary assistance and/or referrals to treatment options, recovery support, counseling and mental health treatment services, in accordance with the approved application attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated as if fully rewritten herein. The Recipient agrees that it will be liable to repay any funds spent in a manner inconsistent with this Agreement or the stated purpose as determined by the Ohio Attorney General ("Attorney General"). This Agreement may only be modified with the prior approval of the Attorney General. All modifications to this Agreement will be in writing and signed by both parties to this Agreement. Any change from the application in Exhibit A without a modification to this Agreement will be grounds for recapture of the funds by the Attorney General.
- II. <u>Limitations on Use of Funds</u>. Funds received under this Agreement will not be used for any political campaign or governmental lobbying in a partisan manner. Expenses to be reimbursed under this Agreement must be performed during the Award Period stated above.
- III. <u>Disbursement of Funds</u>. Funds will be disbursed monthly on a reimbursement basis upon the Attorney General's receipt of: (1) a Request for Payment Report, the form of which will be provided by the Attorney General and is attached to this Agreement as Exhibit B for reference, from Recipient documenting the services provided for the previous month; and (2) a Monthly Reporting Questionnaire, the form of which will be provided by the Attorney General and is attached to this Agreement as Exhibit C for reference. Request for Payment Reports and Monthly Reporting Questionnaires are due by the fifteenth of each month for the previous month's expenses. After receipt and approval by the Attorney General of a completed Request for Payment Report, payment will be made pursuant to Ohio Adm.Code 126.30. Unless otherwise directed by the Attorney General, completed Request for Payment Reports and Monthly Reporting Questionnaires should be directed via email to: Invoices@OhioAGO.gov. Disbursements are contingent upon the timely submission and approval of all required program and financial reports and compliance with the requirements set forth in Section IX below. Unexpended funds must be returned to the Attorney General.
- IV. <u>Ethics/Conflict of Interest</u>. The Recipient, by signature on this document, certifies that it has reviewed and understands the Ohio ethics and conflict of interest laws, and will take no action inconsistent with those laws.
- V. <u>Non-Discrimination</u>. Pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") 125.111 and the Attorney General's policy, Recipient agrees that Recipient and any person acting on behalf of Recipient shall not discriminate, by reason of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, age, disability, military status, national origin, or ancestry against any citizen of this state in the employment of any person qualified and available to perform the work under this Agreement. Recipient further agrees that Recipient and any person acting on behalf of Recipient shall not, in any manner, discriminate against, intimidate, or retaliate against any employee hired for the performance of work under this Agreement on account of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, age, disability, military status, national origin, or ancestry.

- VI. <u>Compliance with Law</u>. The Recipient, in expending the funds, agrees to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances.
- VII. <u>Authority to Bind Parties</u>. The person signing this document on behalf of Recipient is legally authorized to contractually obligate the Recipient.
- VIII. <u>Certification of Funds</u>. It is expressly understood and agreed by the parties that none of the rights, duties, and obligations described in this Agreement shall be binding on either party until all relevant statutory provisions of the Ohio Revised Code, including, but not limited to, R.C. 126.07, have been complied with, and until such time as all necessary funds are available or encumbered and, when required, such expenditure of funds is approved by the Controlling Board of the State of Ohio, or in the event that grant funds are used, until such time that the Attorney General gives Recipient written notice that such funds have been made available to the Attorney General by the Attorney General's funding source.
- IX. Reporting Requirement. Recipient shall submit a report by January 31, 2025 and a final report by July 31, 2025 to the Attorney General describing the use of the funds during the Award Period and the outcome received from the expenditure of the funds. These reports shall include the information on attachment Exhibit D, 2025 DART Semiannual-Annual Report Form. These reports shall be sent to the following address: GrantsManagement@OhioAGO.gov. Additionally, pursuant to Section 221.20 of Amended Substitute House Bill No. 33 of the 135th General Assembly, Recipient shall, within six months of the end date of the Award Period, submit a written report describing the outcomes that resulted from the award to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Minority Leader of the Senate, and the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives.
- X. <u>Relationship of Parties</u>. It is fully understood and agreed that Recipient is an independent contractor and neither Recipient nor its personnel shall at any time, or for any purpose, be considered agents, servants, or employees of the Attorney General for the purpose of Ohio Public Employees Retirement Systems benefits.
- XI. <u>Time of Performance</u>. Notwithstanding the foregoing, as the current General Assembly cannot commit a future General Assembly to expenditure, this Agreement shall expire no later than June 30, 2025. The Attorney General may renew this Agreement for an additional one-year term on the same terms and conditions by giving written notice prior to expiration. Such renewal shall begin July 1, 2025 and shall expire no later than June 30, 2026, unless sooner terminated as set forth herein.

WORK PLAN ESSAYS

1. What would the grant funds be used for?

The grant funds will be used to pay for the wages and linge benefits of police and line department personnel and to cover the cost of a drug counselor. This team will visit the survivors of an overdose who reside in the City of Strongsville. If the survivor lives outside of the Strongsville City limits, at minimum, a phone call will be placed to the survivor or their family. Trealment options and resources will be provided to the survivors and their families. The ultimate goal is to have the survivor receive the appropriate treatment for their addiction. With the consent of the families and/or survivors, the team will maintain contact to offer additional resources and to monitor their progress. The team will also assist those in our city jail or those who voluntarily come to our police department who wish to seek treatment for their drug addiction. The funds also will be used personnel to participate in public relations activities to increase awareness and educate the public about the addiction and treatment options.

The primary purpose of the grant is support of law enforcement programs that address the opioid epidemic. Please explain any desired expansion of the program considered necessary to meet the current needs of your community.

Our department has been running this program since 2017. We continue to communicate with individuals suffering from addiction and their families to offer them support and resources. Due to the amount of people we strive to remain in contact with, more time and money is needed for this purpose. There has been an increase of those in our jail population who wish to seek treatment upon their release. This expansion will decrease recidivism among those who commit crimes because of their addiction. The primary purpose of this program is to help those with an addiction to opioids, but we may encounter others in our community who have addictions to other drugs that would benefit from our services. We will help these individuals when the need arises. We will also cover this program at community events including our Citizens Police Academy and visit health fairs to increase awareness about addiction and decrease the stigma associated with addiction. We also want to reach out to families to offer them resources.

 Outline objectives that will result from the proposed project. Objectives are specific, observable, time-framed and measurable.

The objectives associated with this grant include making contact with 50% of the survivors of an overdose within 72 hours of their overdose. Another objective of this grant is to assist 30% of overdose survivors to engage in treatment services for their addiction during this grant cycle. Another objective of this grant is to assist 80% of those who willingly ask for help finding treatment either through our city jail or by contacting our department to enroll in treatment. Our department will also aim to participate in at least 2 community events to educate the community about addiction and to decrease the stigma associated with addiction. These objectives will be measured on a monthly, annual, and length of the project basis.

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 Describe the steps necessary to accomplish your objectives, including an operational schedule for the project.

To accomplish the objectives of this project, members of the response team will convene at least twice a week to contact survivors, follow up with those we have contacted, and educate the public. The officers who initially respond to a reported overdose are crucial to the success of this program. Our department has created cards that are given to the survivor at their overdose that describes the program and provides a phone number that the survivor can contact to make an appointment for the response team to visit or answer any questions they may have. If the survivor does not wish to go to treatment upon the first visit by the response team, the team will continue to follow-up with the survivor. Our corrections officers will provide information to inmates in our jall about this program. If they wish to seek help, this can be facilitated upon their release from our jail.

Who will be responsible for completing the work necessary to achieve the objectives? Please list

The responsible parties to complete the necessary work and achieve objectives are Onio Guidestone and all the police officers and fire medios who work on this project. The Support Services Lleutenant with the police department will be responsible for the oversight and reporting for this grant. Ohio Guklestone is certified by the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services.

The ultimate goal of this program is to reduce drug overdoses in the City of Strongsville. The objectives outlined in section (3) will be measured using a combination of a spreadsheet and an application developed by our IT department. The Support Services Lieutenant with the police department will be responsible for collecting the necessary data. After the data is compiled for the previous month and finalized, a monthly report summary will be generated. The monthly report will contain the number of overdoses, the number of survivors contacted within 72 hours, the number of overdose deaths, the number of contacts with overdose survivors, the number of survivors referred to treatment, the number of people referred to our department for assistance for their addiction, and any public relations activities conducted by team members. These statistics will be used to demonstrate progress toward meeting stated objectives and dictate any changes needed to improve the program.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024 - 134

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENGAGE BREWER-GARRETT COMPANY TO CONDUCT AN INVESTMENT GRADE AUDIT IN ORDER TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE ENERGY SAVINGS PERFORMANCE PROGRAM AND TO NEGOTIATE AND ENTER INTO A PROJECT IMPLEMENTATION AGREEMENT FOR THE ENERGY CONSERVATION AND BUILDING IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Energy Conservation and Building Improvement Project has been identified as a way to provide a full range of analytical services for potential related capital improvements in order to reduce the consumption and related costs of energy and increase performance operation efficiency for the City of Strongsville; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 2024-085 passed on June 3, 2024, the Mayor was authorized to advertise for a Request for Qualifications ("RFQ") for the Energy Conservation and Building Improvement Project; and

WHEREAS, therefore, pursuant to Sections 153.65 through 153.73 of the Ohio Revised Code, the City selected two firms which it considered to be the most qualified to provide the required services for this Project; and

WHEREAS, after analyzing the proposals and interviewing the two firms, the City has determined that Brewer-Garrett Company is the most qualified vendor to prepare an energy conservation report; and

WHEREAS, the City of Strongsville is prepared to commence with the Energy Conservation and Building Improvement Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

- **Section 1.** That the Mayor be and is hereby authorized to engage **BREWER-GARRETT COMPANY** to conduct an investment grade audit to develop a comprehensive energy savings performance program (the "Analysis") and to negotiate and enter into a project implementation agreement for the Energy Conservation and Building Improvement Project (the "Agreement").
- **Section 2.** There is no cost for the Analysis, and the Analysis shall conform to Ohio Revised Code Section 717.02(B).
- **Section 3.** That any funds for the purpose of said Agreement have been appropriated and shall be paid from the General Capital Improvement Fund.
- **Section 4.** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in

such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to enter into an agreement in order to preserve and properly maintain City-owned properties, to reduce energy consumption, and to conserve public funds. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
