Strongsville again saw a number of new restaurants and food-oriented businesses open over this last year.

The city has a rich history of hosting eateries with a variety of cuisines.

In 2023, new offerings didn't disappoint:

Corner 11, a poke and ramen restaurant, opened for business at 17100 Royalton Road, in the Ledgewood Plaza.

The Hooley Pub & Kitchen started serving in SouthPark Mall.

Thai Dynamite now offers Bangkok street food at 10917 Prospect Road, at Albion.



White Flower Cake Shoppe moved into 15131 Pearl Road, in Towne Center Plaza.

Giovanni's Pizza and Chicken has reopened at 19772 West 130th Street, at Bennetts Corners.

Akshaya Patra, a dine-in Indian restaurant, took over the former Crown of India space at 14224 Pearl Road. KPot, a Korean barbecue and hot pot restaurant, is expected soon at SouthPark,.

On the way: Dunkin' will build its third Strongsville location at the site of the Village Motel on Pearl Road, and Biggby Coffee is moving into a former bank building at 11654 Pearl Road.

And Brusters Ice Cream is still planning to open a shop on the south end of Pearl.

Work Continues on Town Center Enhancement

Construction will continue through the winter on the Town Center Enhancement and Walkability project so amenities can be available to residents next summer.

Crews are currently doing ground work to fill in and level the area in anticipation of new asphalt, trails and a



roundabout at the intersection of Zverina, Roe and Westwood. The project will include a new playground, a pavilion, splash pad, tennis and pickleball courts, sand volleyball and half-court basketball courts, plus open space for games or concerts and a food truck area.

The entire area will also be made more walkable.

Don't Be a Victim this Holiday Season: Strongsville Police

Thieves are out in force over the holidays, taking advantage of crowds of distracted shoppers.

Police say you should:

Guard your wallet — Make sure your purse is zipped or snapped shut, and never put it in a shopping cart. Pickpockets can reach inside in a flash. Men should carry wallets in a front pocket or zipped jacket pocket.

Don't leave stuff in the car

 Bags of merchandise are too tempting for a thief. Put your purchases in the trunk. Shut out thieves at home — Burglars know you have gifts in your house. Make sure your doors and windows are locked, and leave lights on. Don't leave valuables in your

car, and lock your car doors.

Don't give till it hurts — Fake charity scams are everywhere this time of year. Double check before donating.
