Aluminum Cans Benefit Burned Children

Did you know you can help children who have suffered burns by donating your aluminum beverage cans to Aluminum Cans for Burned Children?

There are drop-off bins at all four of Strongsville's fire stations. To help, instead of putting cans in your curbside recycling,



set them aside and take them (bagged) to a fire station.

ACBC uses the money from recycling the aluminum to pay for equipment and other items not covered by insurance, and to send pediatric burn survivors to Camp Phoenix, a fun and therapeutic four-day adventure, which is held at Camp Cheerful in Strongsville.

"Residents and businesses are encouraged to save their aluminum cans and instead of setting out curbside, we ask that you drop the cans off at any one of the city's fire stations. These donations can really make a difference," Fire Chief Jack Drayes said.



Fireworks are still Illegal Here

Strongsville City Council has opted out of a new state law that permits residents to set off consumergrade fireworks on or around certain holidays, meaning it is still against the law here.

A number of area cities have chosen to continue to ban neighborhood fireworks displays.

Summer Scams: Be Wary of Door-to-Door Contractors

officials are urging residents to be wary about contractors going door-to-door to solicit services like tree-trimming, roofing, driveway repair and more.

While some are legitimate businesses, some are not.

First, NEVER walk outside with a solicitor to check out an alleged problem. Sometimes, an accomplice is hiding nearby, and slips into your house while you're distracted, stealing whatever he can grab.

Second, check to see if he is displaying a current solici-

tor's permit issued by the Strongsville Police Department.

Next, check references -make sure the company is registered with the Building Department. Also, don't give money up front to an unknown contractor who promises to return to do the job -- no matter how friendly and honest he seems.

Businesses on the Move

Construction continues on a new **Auto Zone** being built at the corner of Royalton and Prospect roads, near the Drug Mart plaza.

Work is also still underway on a warehouse and distribution center for **Schaeffler Group**, an automotive part supplier. The building is on Route 82 across from Vitalia Senior Living.

Local Bar is building an outdoor patio at its location at 14751 Pearl Road. The 713-square-foot patio will seat up to 64 patrons.

Encompass Health is building a 48,000-square-foot rehabilitation center on Pearl Road at Rockglen Drive.
