Police Issue Regulations for Riding E-Bikes

S trongsville police have compiled a list of Ohio regulations for how and where ebikes can be operated.

Electric bikes, which are regular bicycles with an integrated electric motor and battery to assist the rider, come in three basic classes:



Class 1—Pedal assisted only; motor cuts out at 20 mph. If operating on a sidewalk, the motor cannot be engaged. On the road, rider must obey all traffic laws. Front white light and back red light and reflectors required.

Class 2 — Pedal and throttle controlled. Motor cuts out at 20 mph. Same rules as for Class 1.

Class 3 — Pedal and throttle controlled. Motor cuts out at 28 mph. Operators must be at least 16 and must wear a helmet. Passengers must wear a helmet. Motor cannot be engaged on sidewalks. Front white light and rear red light and reflectors required.



Fireworks are still Illegal Here

ireworks are legal in Ohio, but are still against the law in Strongsville. The city has opted out of the state law that permits residents to set off consumer-grade fireworks on or around certain holidays, including July 4.

A number of area cities have chosen to continue to ban neighborhood fireworks displays.

Be Alert to Fraud when Hiring a Contractor

Residents should be wary of door-to-door contractors this summer and check before hiring someone for tree-trimming, roofing, driveway repair and other projects.

While some are legitimate businesses, some are not, officials warn.

First, never walk outside with a solicitor to check out an alleged problem. Sometimes, an accomplice is hiding nearby and will slip into your house while you're distracted, stealing whatever he can grab.

Second, check to see if the contractor is displaying a current solicitor's permit issued by the Strongsville Police Department.

Next, make sure the company is registered with the Building Department. And don't give money up front, no matter how friendly and honest the contractor seems.
