New Dining, Food Options Coming to Rt. 82

Three new dining-related businesses are moving onto Royalton Road near SouthPark Mall — two of them new to the area.

Seafood Shake is renovating the former Rockne's at the Plaza at SouthPark for a Cajun seafood restaurant.

It will be the second Seafood Shake in northeast Ohio the other is in Coventry and will be the first seafood boil-type restaurant in Strongsville.

Also new to this area is Crumbl Cookies, which is planning to open in a vacant storefront in the Plaza at SouthPark next to Rosewood Grill.



The store features large cookies in flavors that change weekly, as well as ice cream.

The closest Crumbl to Strongsville is currently in Avon.

Also filling a vacant building will be Chipotle, which will take over the vacant Panera spot by the Ledgewood Plaza. Panera vacated that site when it moved a little west on Royalton Road to join the Royalton Collection.

Chipotle will move across the street from its location at SouthPark Mall to the freestanding building.

Coyotes are on the Move in the Early Spring: Watch Pets

t's mating season for coyotes, making the animals more active and likely to be seen during daylight hours.

Animal Control Officer Chuck McCleary advises residents to take extra precautions when letting their pets outside.

First, scan your yard to make

sure no coyotes are lurking before letting your dog out. Don't leave your dog unattended, and if you have cats, don't let them outside — especially overnight.

There are also ways to animal -proof your property so coyotes and other wildlife don't hang around.

Celebrate Strongsville

The city's theme this year, "Celebrate Strongsville," will be on display with three fireworks shows on the Commons in 2022.

Instead of having a separate show at Foltz athletic fields on July 4, there will



be a fireworks display on the Commons on June 17, during the Strongsville City Club Rib Burnoff, as well as on July 17, during the Strongsville Chamber of Commerce Homecoming.

While the move will spread out the shows better — one in June, one in July and one in November as part of the Winter Wonderland — cost is also a major factor. Most people know that donations pay for the purchase of the fireworks, but they don't realize it costs the city over \$100,000 to prepare the Foltz site for the July 4 fireworks, provide crowd and traffic control, and to clean up afterward.
