Memorial Day Parade and Ceremony Set

The annual Memorial Day parade and ceremony will take place Monday, May 29.

The parade steps off at 11 a.m. from St. Joseph Church and heads south on Pearl Road to Zverina Lane. It ends at the Freedom Trail gazebo with a short ceremony.

Mayor Tom Perciak will be among the speakers. The Strongsville High School marching band is expected to participate in both the parade and ceremony.

The event is sponsored by Strongsville VFW Post 3345 to honor the nation's fallen military heroes.

Renovated Ward 3 Fire Station Up and Running

The Ward 3 Fire Station is up and running at full speed again after several months of renovations.

The public was invited to tour the station April 30 following a re-dedication ceremony.

Upgrades were made to the locker rooms, bathrooms and sleeping quarters. A new roof, windows and ventilation system were installed, and electrical fixtures were replaced with LED lighting.

The project also included concrete work, expanding the workout room and painting the inside.

The station has stood since 1980 at the corner of Albion

"There's a good part of our department that wasn't even born in 1980," Fire Chief Jack Draves noted during the dedication ceremony.

Drop Off Household Hazardous Waste May 3-6

The first of the two 2016 Household Hazardous Waste Collections is set for May 3-6 at the Service Center, 16099 Foltz Pkwy.

Residents can drop off their household products 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. May 3-5 and 8 a.m. to noon Saturday, May 6.



Materials accepted include oil or solvent-based paint (no latex paint), varnish, mineral spirits, caustic household cleaners, adhesives, gasoline, sealers, polyurethane, herbicides, automotive fluids, roof tar, lighter fluid, primers and coatings, shellac, pesticides, motor oil, driveway sealer, mercury, paint thinner, turpentine, fungicides, car batteries, kerosene and fluorescent bulbs.

LATEX PAINT IS NOT ACCEPTED. To dispose of latex paint, leave the lid off to dry up the paint — or mix in a drying agent available at home improvement stores — then place it out with your regular trash for collection.
