Here's the Fall 2020 Leaf Collection Schedule

Strongsville's Service Department will pick up leaves in October and November.

Here's the schedule:

If you live NORTH of Royalton Road, crews will be in your area the weeks of Oct. 19 and Nov. 2

If you live SOUTH of Royalton Road, crews will be by the weeks of Oct. 26 and Nov. 9.

You should have your leaves piled near the curb (not in the road or ditch, and no more than 4 feet from the street) on the FIRST day of the collection week. Do not bag leaves, and please remove branches, rocks, metal and other items that could damage pick-up equipment. There will be no collection after Nov. 25.

Branches should be bundled in 3-4 foot lengths and put out with your regular trash.

Businesses on the Move
