The old Panera building on Royalton Road will be renovated and **Chipotle** will move there from the mall.

Messy Aprons is a new cheesecake bakery on Pearl Road, and Fusion Mediterranean Grill has opened on Drake at Prospect.

Here's the Fall 2022 Leaf Collection Schedule

Strongsville's Service Department will pick up leaves in October and November.

Here's the schedule:

If you live NORTH of Royalton Road, crews will be in your area the weeks of Oct. 17, Oct. 31 and Nov. 14.

If you live SOUTH of Royalton Road, crews will be by the weeks of Oct. 24, Nov. 7 and Nov. 21.

You should have your leaves piled near the curb (not in the road or ditch, and no more than 4 feet from the street) by 7 a.m. on the FIRST day of the collection week.

Do not bag leaves, and please remove branches, rocks, metal and other items that could damage pick-up equipment.

Additional collections may be added, but leaf trucks are also used for plowing snow, which takes precedence.
