

**SUMMARY OF CAUCUS DISCUSSION AND MINUTES OF THE STRONGSVILLE CITY COUNCIL
REGULAR MEETING HELD ON, MONDAY, JANUARY 6, 2020.**

The Council of the City of Strongsville met in the Caucus Room at the Mike Kalinich Sr. City Council Chamber, 18688 Royalton Road, on **Monday, January 6, 2020 at 7:00 p.m.**

Present: Council Members: Matthew A. Schonhut, Annmarie P. Roff, James A. Kaminski, Joseph C. DeMio, Kelly A. Kosek, Gordon C. Short and James E. Carbone. **Also Present:** Clerk of Council Aimee Pientka. **Administration:** Mayor Thomas P. Perciak, Law Director Neal M. Jamison, Finance Director Joe Dubovec, Economic Development Director Brent Painter, Communications and Technology Director David E. Sems, Service Director Joe Walker, Recreation and Senior Services Director Bryan Bogre, Building Commissioner Tony Biondillo, City Engineer Ken Mikula, Human Resource Director Steve Kilo, Public Safety Director Charles Goss, Fire Chief Jack Draves and Police Chief Mark Fender.

Also in attendance was Assistant Law Director Dan Kolick.

Council President DeMio called the caucus to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mr. Carbone made a motion to adjourn into executive session for the purpose of discussing civil litigation matters. It was seconded by Mr. Schonhut to adjourn from open session into executive session [Article XI, Section 9, City Charter]. All members present voted aye and the motion carried. Council adjourned into executive session at 7:02 p.m. Ms. Kosek was not in attendance during this session. Also present from the Administration: Mayor Thomas P. Perciak, Law Director Neal Jamison, Assistant Law Director Dan Kolick, Building Commissioner Tony Biondillo and David Cuppage, outside Counsel for the city. The executive session concluded at 7:23 p.m. and reconvened into open session.

The following Council Committees met to review legislation on the agenda:

Planning, Zoning & Engineering Committee: Chairman Schonhut advised Ordinance No. 2019-184 is to rezone property located at Drake Road and Prospect Road (PPNs 394-21-010, 394-21-012, 394-21-014 and 394-21-015) from LB (Local Business) classification to R1-75 (One Family 75) classification. Planning Commission gave this an unfavorable recommendation at its meeting held on December 19th. Mr. Schonhut was not able to attend that meeting. Mayor Perciak advised it was a unanimous vote of no from the Commission. The concern was taking commercial property away to be used for residential purposes. In that area, one side is commercial and another side is industrial. There is also some vacant land there and a shopping center across the street. Mr. Kaminski stated that is difficult because there are residential houses over there grandfathered in (as a conditional use). Mayor Perciak is concerned about setting a precedent for future developers. Ms. Kosek asked if there is a concern of a lawsuit involving this particular rezoning. Mayor Perciak advised not at this time. This will be placed on second reading and set for a public hearing on February 18th. Ordinance No. 2020-001 is to authorize the mayor to enter into an agreement with a firm of professional engineers to provide engineering design and consulting services in connection with the Foltz Parkway Extension Phase II Project. This agreement is with MS Consultants, Inc. Mr. Schonhut advised this will be placed on first reading because some members of council still have some questions in regards to this. Mr. Mikula and Lori Daley have advised they are available to answer any questions council may have related to this.

Public Safety & Health Committee: Chairman Short recommended suspension and adoption for Ordinance No. 2020-002. This is to continue the agreement with the City of Berea for public safety dispatch services. The agreement is retroactive to January 1, 2020. Suspension and adoption was recommended for Ordinance No. 2020-003. This is also an agreement with the City of Brook Park for public safety dispatch services and is also retroactive to January 1, 2020. For both of these cities, there was an increase of 6% for these services. Ordinance No. 2020-004 is an agreement with Cuyahoga County and the Cuyahoga County Juvenile Court in connection with the city's community diversion program. Suspension and adoption was recommended for this legislation.

Public Service & Conservation Committee: Chairwoman Roff recommended suspension and adoption for Ordinance No. 2020-005. This is to sell at internet auction certain obsolete property no longer needed for use by the city's service department. Ordinance No. 2020-006 is to dispose of equipment no longer needed for use by the service department. Suspension and adoption was recommended for this legislation. Suspension and adoption was also recommended for Resolution No. 2020-007; a resolution to repurchase certain certificates for burial rights in the Strongsville Municipal Cemetery. Resolution No. 2020-008 is to correcting the record for certain certificates for burial rights in the Strongsville Municipal Cemetery. Suspension and adoption was recommended for this legislation.

Economic Development Committee:

Motion made by Ms. Kosek, second by Mr. Carbone, to approve the Economic Development Committee meeting minutes of December 9, 2019. All members present voted aye and the motion carried.

Committee of the Whole: Mr. DeMio advised there will be two appointments at tonight's meeting for the city's Planning Commission. Mr. Walker advised this week they will be conducting interviews with engineering firms in connection with the large scale sanitary sewer treatment plants' project. This will be approximately \$6 million dollars' worth of improvements. He invited any council members, who are interested, to attend the meetings. Mr. DeMio asked when the traffic signals at the center of town will be functional with the new system. Mr. Mikula advised sometime in 2021. Mr. DeMio advised he heard from a resident that a semi went beyond where the sensors used to be and got held up right in the middle of the intersection of Pearl Road and Royalton Road causing a big back up. Mr. Mikula advised there are currently no working sensors in that area. The lights are currently all on a system timing.

Mr. Carbone made a motion to adjourn into executive session for the purpose of discussing personnel matters. It was seconded by Mr. Schonhut to adjourn from open session into executive session [Article XI, Section 9, City Charter]. All members present voted aye and the motion carried. Council adjourned into executive session at 7:39 p.m. The executive session concluded at 8:04 p.m. and reconvened into open session.

PLANNING, ZONING AND ENGINEERING – Mr. Schonhut: We do have two ordinances, Ordinance No. 2019-184 is a rezoning at the intersections of Drake Rd. and Prospect Rd. We'll put that on second reading tonight and have a public hearing February 18th. Then we have Ordinance No. 2020-001; this is for engineering design and consulting services in connection with Foltz Parkway extension, phase II. We are going to put that on first reading tonight. That is all that I have for Planning, Zoning and Engineering unless anybody has any questions for me.

PUBLIC SAFETY AND HEALTH – Mr. Short: Thank you Mr. Schonhut, we have three ordinances tonight. Ordinance No. 2020-002 and 2020-003 both deal with authorizing the administration to enter into a contract for the public safety dispatch services with the cities of Berea and Brook Park, to be effective January 1, 2020. Both of these are an amendment to the original contracts which represent a 6% fee increase to both of those cities for the services that our dispatch center provides to those cities. The recommendation there is to suspend and adopt. Then we have Ordinance No. 2020-004. This is an ordinance to approve a grant from Cuyahoga County in connection with the juvenile court community diversion program for first time offenders. It is a grant for \$16,000.00. The recommendation there is to suspend and adopt so we can accept that funding from the county. That will close my committee but I'll happily take any questions.

Mr. Schonhut – Does anybody have anything for Mr. Short?

PUBLIC SERVICE AND CONSERVATION – Ms. Roff: I have 4 ordinances today. I have Ordinance No. 2020-005; that's an ordinance allowing the city to place items no longer of need on the internet for auction. The recommendation there is to suspend and adopt. I have Ordinance No. 2020-006; that is to dispose of 3 items of zero value. The recommendation there is to suspend and adopt. Then I have 2 resolutions. Resolution No. 2020-007; this is a resolution granting permission to purchase a certificate for burial rights. The recommendation there is to suspend and adopt. I have Resolution No. 2020-008; this is to correct an item in the records for a lot in the cemetery to correct that in the record book. The recommendation there is suspend and adopt.

Mr. Schonhut – Any questions for Ms. Roff?

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE – Mr. DeMio: There was nothing before Council of the Whole. I know we went into executive session over some legal issues. Outside of that, I will close it because I don't think there's any questions otherwise.

Mr. Schonhut – Awesome, well we would certainly like to thank you for two great years of leading us up here; so thank you very much.

Mr. DeMio – If you make half the people happy you've done the right thing...kind of a lawyer thing right Neal?

Mr. DeMio – Matt, you're going to do an awesome job. Gordon, you're going to do an awesome job. John Piter, 15630 Indianhead Lane, Strongsville, OH: John Piter, 15630 Indianhead Lane. Congratulations Mr. President, Mr. Mayor, members of council. I'm here tonight to ask some questions actually. It's about the change in the deed restriction for Kids First property on Howe Road. I would like to know why they're asking for the change in the restriction. I don't know if I'll get any answers tonight. Who is asking for that change? Basically, like I said, I have some other questions of why they want to change it and what is the restriction now? I don't know if anybody can answer that question tonight.

Mr. Jamison – Thank you sir, I don't know if it was the last meeting or the meeting before, the owner of the property there came forward to council and with his legal counsel, made a presentation; so they are the ones who have approached council and the city to potentially do it. There is nothing pending right now. Currently, the owner placed on himself a restriction a number of years ago restricting it to a certain use, a daycare center, and also the name that is used for that facility. The request is to amend that. There is nothing pending right now; that is just a request that has been made. There is nothing formal that has been presented to this council or city. There is no action that this council is taking at this time. It is just something that the owner brought forward to council's attention at the last meeting; but there is nothing pending right now.

Mr. Piter – I see, well I just wanted to know that because I'd like to see that deed restriction kept on that property because it could turn into anything else. I don't know what the zoning is for that property right now; but I'll find out.

Mr. Jamison – It's a unique zoning.

Mr. Piter – Unique zoning?


