

SUMMARY OF CAUCUS DISCUSSION AND MINUTES OF THE REGULAR STRONGSVILLE COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON APRIL 19, 2010.

The Council of the City of Strongsville met in the Caucus Room at the Strongsville Communications Center, 13213 Pearl Road, on ***Monday, April 19, 2010 at 7:30 p.m.***

The following Committees met to review legislation on the agenda:

Finance Committee: Chairman Dooner recommended suspension and adoption for Ordinance No. 2010-044, making appropriations for the current expenses and other expenditures for the year 2010 and repealing Ordinance No. 2010-039. Mr. Dooner noted that the ordinance has been revised to include an additional \$500,000 earmarked for road repair and commented to Mr. Roth that Mr. Roth doesn't have to vote against the ordinance because it includes additional funds for road work. Law Director Kraus advised that a motion to amend by substitution is necessary, followed by a motion to suspend, prior to moving to adopt the ordinance as amended. Chairman Dooner recommended suspension and adoption for Resolution 2010-057, adopting alternative tax budget information for the fiscal year 2011. Mayor Perciak interjected that the County requires this information.

Planning, Zoning and Engineering: Chairman Coyne recommended Ordinance No. 2010-045, accepting for recording purposes only the plat of Schneider Reserve Subdivision, Phase 3, Ordinance No. 2010-046, authorizing the Mayor to accept a grant of easement for storm sewer purposes in connection with the Schneider Reserve Subdivision, Phase 3, Resolution No. 2010-047, confirming Planning Commission approval of the final site and landscaping plan for the co-location of Cingular Wireless telecommunication equipment at 15471 Royalton Road, and Ordinance No. 2010-058, accepting for recording purposes only the plat of Hickory Branch Subdivision.

Public Service and Conservation Committee – Chairman Haseley recommended suspension and adoption for Ordinance 2010-048, ratifying, confirming, and approving the filing of an application for financial assistance with the Cuyahoga County Solid Waste District and authorizing the acceptance of the award of a grant under the 2010 Community Recycling Awareness Grant Program, and Resolution No. 2010-059, authorizing the Mayor to advertise a request for qualifications and proposals for engineering consulting services for asset assessment and valuation in connection with the City's wastewater treatment plants and pumping facilities.

Committee of the Whole: President Gallagher recommended suspension and adoption for Resolution No. 2010-056, supporting the Cuyahoga County Health and Human Services Renewal Levy, Issue No. 15.

Economic Development and Technology Committee: Chairman Daymut reported that the breakfast meeting for May 20 has been finalized and a speaker should be secured by tomorrow. He stated since he was absent at the last Council meeting, he will give a report on the floor tonight regarding the last Committee meeting on March 22. The next Committee meeting is Monday, April 26.

Public Safety and Health Committee: In lieu of Chairman DeMio, Vice Chairman Gallagher recommended suspension and adoption for Ordinance No. 2010-049, amending sections of Chapter 832 of the Codified Ordinances dealing with massage establishments. Chief Goss stated they are trying to bring the current ordinance up to state guidelines and state statute since requirements set by the medical board have evolved over past years. He stated this is really a housekeeping measure, getting into sync with state code and also, in some regards, making it a little tougher, since they are going to require background checks in cases that the existing ordinance does not. Mr. Gallagher recommended suspension and adoption for Ordinance No. 2010-050, authorizing the Mayor to enter into an agreement and ratify acceptance of a grant award from the Board of Cuyahoga County Commissioners under the fiscal year 2007 Urban Area Security Initiative Grant Program for activities, training and services for use by the City's Fire Department. Chief Moody stated this is a Homeland Security program, it is the Urban Area Security Initiative, they are offering a multitude of items under that grant – training, some equipment, some medical supplies, and we will be able to take advantage of all those things. Suspension and adoption was the recommendation for Resolution No. 2010-051, authorizing the Mayor to advertise for bids for food service. Mr. Gallagher also recommended suspension and adoption for Ordinance 2010-060, authorizing the Mayor to enter into a State of Ohio administrative services contract for the purchase of one new Medtec ambulance unit for use by the Fire Department with the sale, trade-in and credit for an existing obsolete ambulance. Chief Moody stated the new Medtec ambulance is another ambulance to replace a ten-year old vehicle with over 100,000 miles on it. He stated we try to replace one of these at a time so that we are not ending up paying for four or five new ambulances at one time. He stated we would trade in the 10-year old ambulance, which is a reserve unit, with 100,000 miles on it. He explained that average service in a municipality like Strongsville, we should get about five years of front line service out of an ambulance and two years of reserve service, so after about seven years we should be getting rid of the vehicle. The trade-in vehicle is ten years old, so it is past the average service life. He stated part of the reason we're bid out of sync is because of the American LaFrance bankruptcy a couple of years ago put us a year behind, so we are trying to play catch-up a little bit. The new ambulance will basically serve as a front-line ambulance and replace that ten-year old vehicle. Mr. Daymut asked the Chief if the new ambulance is going to be a Trident. Chief Moody responded that it is going to be like the one we purchased in 2008; it is not a Trident, but it has a foam suppression system on it that you mix water and foam together and it is cold air compressed foam. He continued that what is nice about this particular system is that it has fire suppression capabilities on it that can be removed and put on a new truck in the future; it is a portable unit that can be pulled off when this unit is traded in and used on a new truck in the future.

Mr. DeMio arrived at the meeting at approximately 7:45 p.m.

Mr. Gallagher asked if any of the directors had anything they wanted to share with Council.

Law Director Kraus informed the Council that at the next meeting he hopes to have legislation confirming Planning Commission approval and a site lease agreement between the Cities of Strongsville, Cleveland and Nextel to relocate the temporary antenna installations to the City of Cleveland water tower. Due to time constraints on our police facility project, it may become necessary to permit them to mobilize for construction prior to the May 3 Council meeting.

Mr. Gallagher asked if any Council member had anything to share with the directors.

Mr. Dooner told Mr. Walker he received a call from a resident on Evergreen Drive; the resident said everything is pretty bad and they want to make sure that out of these monies they will be getting the road at least repaired, as it has a lot of chuckholes. Mr. Walker replied Evergreen is definitely on the list to consider. Mr. Roth stated he has voiced this many times. Mr. Dooner stated the comment the resident made to him is that the resident is upset because he said he spoke with Mr. Roth and Mr. Roth told the resident they could not get anything done because they are on the wrong side of the tracks. Mr. Roth denied saying that. Mr. Dooner stated the resident told him that. Mr. Roth stated he has not spoken with anyone on Evergreen in years. Mr. Dooner reiterated that the resident said he talked to Mr. Roth. Mr. Roth stated getting back to Mr. Dooner's comment about the budget; we need to reprioritize the budget for more road money because we have got twelve of them that are a mess. Mr. Dooner stated the Finance Committee will have a meeting in June regarding appropriating and doing a new budget, and hopefully Mr. Roth can make that meeting. Mr. Gallagher said you can't not vote for the budget and expect streets. Mr. Roth replied that yes, he can. Mr. Gallagher stated no, you can't. Mr. Gallagher told Mr. Roth he can go up to that ice rink, take every nickel of profit, and put it into his ward. Mr. Roth indicated he does not agree with Mr. Gallagher's philosophy. Mr. Gallagher stated it is not a philosophy. Mr. Roth stated there are hundreds and hundreds of things that make up that budget. Mr. Gallagher stated Mr. Roth said that to the resident; why would the resident lie to Mr. Dooner? Mr. Roth denied saying it. Mr. Gallagher questioned why a resident would lie to Mr. Dooner. Mr. Roth maintained that he did not say it to the resident, but he has said many things similar to that, even on the floor. Mr. Gallagher stated Mr. Roth has no right to say anything similar to that because he votes every time against money and he asks for roads. Mr. Gallagher told Mr. Roth to go out on the floor tonight and ask for a street and find out what happens. Mr. Roth accused Mr. Gallagher of playing politics. Mr. Gallagher stated Mr. Roth is the one playing dirty politics and he is sick and tired of Mr. Roth's tactics. Mr. Roth stated innocent people drive down Albion Road from Idlewood Trail to the railroad tracks. Mr. Gallagher stated Mr. Roth is elected to represent them, so he should represent them. Mr. Gallagher reiterated his comment that Mr. Roth go on TV and ask for a road and see what happens. Mr. Roth stated every time he does, Mr. Gallagher cuts him off. Mr. Gallagher removed himself from the table, stating he will see Mr. Roth on the floor; he is done. Mr. Roth reiterated that the budget should be reprioritized.

Mr. DeMio asked the Mayor if there are any items for discussion in executive session. The Mayor replied in the negative. Mr. DeMio requested a brief discussion with the Mayor, the Law Director and Council President Gallagher, and then to determine whether the matter is appropriate for executive session discussion. After a brief discussion between the Mayor, Mr. Kraus, Mr. DeMio and Mr. Gallagher, it was determined that an executive session was unnecessary.

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR STRONGSVILLE COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON APRIL 19, 2010 IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBER AT THE STRONGSVILLE COMMUNICATIONS CENTER

CALL TO ORDER:

The Rotary Business Expo, in conjunction with now the Chamber of Commerce, is in the planning stages; I will get that information to you as soon as it is available. Our small business seminars that we are planning for the fall is moving along; we now have some dates and I will get the speakers to the Council and to the general public as soon as they become available. We discussed Polaris Career Center; I had the opportunity to visit and it's a great asset and we think that they will be able to help our industrial partners out here. Storm water fees is a major topic of discussion concerning our industrial partners here and we are following that closely; as you know, the City is heavily involved with challenging that. We have applied for the grant for the Foltz Parkway extension that was due April 1 and as soon as we hear something on that, and we hope it will be favorable, that will also be reported. We received a business update from Brent Painter on the businesses here in Strongsville. Our next meeting will be next Monday, April 26, at 7 p.m. here at the Communications Center. That's all I have this evening, Mr. Gallagher. Thank you very much.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR, DIRECTORS OF DEPARTMENTS AND OTHER OFFICERS:

MAYOR PERCIAK: Thank you, Mr. President. Just one very important communication that I would like to share with everybody. A week ago today, Mr. Mikula, our City Engineer, and myself, we drove to Columbus and we started the process of seeking grant money to finish our last phase of Pearl Road. As most of you are driving Pearl Road today, you are probably experiencing some difficulties getting up and down Pearl on the south side, and that is simply because the road widening process is really in full and we hope to continue to battle that process until it's a hundred percent completed next June. The original plan at this time, according to our construction managers and our Engineer, is to complete the Drake and Pearl Road intersection first and have that all widened and open by Labor Day, and then continue on with the rest of the project. What we're concerned about now is the part of Pearl Road going south from where Parkview Federal is up to the top of the hill, so we are seeking as many dollars as we can for that project. We are again going to ask for five million dollars from ODOT to take us up to the top of the hill.

Mayor Perciak (cont'd) - Now, just our best guess for that project when we're said and done with it is maybe about ten million dollars. But we just want to let everybody know that we are not stopping; our objective is to get that road completed to the top of the hill. But when we were there, we were very clear with the Governor's Executive Assistant that our objective in getting that road done while obviously is to provide convenience for all of us here in our community, but, more importantly, is to open up the last main corridor to the 169 acres that the City owns in the Foltz business parkway – industrial park, the technology park. If we get that, that will really help us deliver additional traffic to the business park in a much safer manner than we are today. So bear along with us and bear along with the dust and the dirt; construction is never easy, but when it's going to be said and done, we'll all be grateful that it is done, and then I'm not sure it'll be done if we go ahead and are able to get the rest of this grant money or as much as we can, so I just want everybody to know we are shaking as many trees in Columbus because now is the time to do it -- the bids are more favorable. So we will let you know as this progresses, but our meeting in Columbus the other day was very good. Mr. Mikula, do you want to add anything on that?

Mr. Mikula – No sir, I think that was very clear, and it was a good meeting and hopefully we'll get the five million as safety million to jumpstart that next phase. Thank you.

Mayor Perciak – Thank you, Mr. President. That's it.

Mr. Gallagher – Thank you, Mayor. Questions for the Mayor?

But it is something, if you want to change your electric rates, please get involved. It's a dire thing. They are giving away discounts now to everybody, you know, but if you go back thirty years or twenty years, there was a big fight with the Illuminating Company and Cleveland Power. And guess what? Cleveland won out. They have cheaper electricity than we do. But they buy their electricity from FirstEnergy. It's amazing. They must be making money hand over fist. But, who am I? Also, we have a tax base here and we need money, and then we turn projects down. We can't be doing this. We need all the tax revenue we can get.
