

SUMMARY OF CAUCUS DISCUSSION AND MINUTES OF THE REGULAR STRONGSVILLE COUNCIL MEETING HELD ON JUNE 07, 2010.

The Council of the City of Strongsville met in the Caucus Room at the Strongsville Communications Center, 13213 Pearl Road, on ***Monday, June 07, 2010 at 7:30 p.m.***

Present: Council Members Patrick J. Coyne, Michael J. Daymut, Joseph C. DeMio, Kenneth M. Dooner, Michael J. Gallagher, Raymond L. Haseley and Mark A. Roth. Also Present: Clerk of Council Leslie J. Seefried. Administration: Mayor Thomas P. Perciak, Law Director Kenneth A. Kraus, Finance Director Joseph K. Dubovec, Service Director Joseph M. Walker, City Engineer Ken Mikula, Building Commissioner Anthony J. Biondillo, Economic Development Manager Brent Painter, Recreation Director Steve Kilo, Human Resources Director Anthony Urankar, Fire Chief Robert Moody and Police Deputy Chief James Kobak.

The following Committees met to review legislation on the agenda:

Public Service and Conservation Committee – Chairman Haseley recommended suspension and adoption as amended for Ordinance No. 2010-069, which authorizes the Mayor to enter into a contract, without public bidding, for the purchase, replacement and installation of one HVAC air unit for use by the Department of Public Service in connection with the City's wastewater treatment facility. This will be amended by substitution due to extra work necessary. The ordinance requires a unanimous affirmative vote for adoption. Ordinance 2010-079 which is the filing of an application for funding through the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council's "Powering our Communities" grant program to install energy conservation measures was recommended for suspension and adoption. Resolution 2010-080 which is advertising for bids for street improvements was recommended for suspension and adoption. Resolution 2010-081 to accept a donation from the Strongsville City Club was recommended for suspension and adoption. The last one, Resolution 2010-082 which grants permission to transfer certain certificates for burial rights was also recommended for suspension and adoption.

Councilman Daymut asked if we have received a list as of yet for the streets. Mr. Mikula stated he could provide a list. The mayor stated they are going to fix as many streets as they possibly can but he doubts if they will be able to fix all the streets that were submitted.

Building and Utilities Committee – Chairman Gallagher stated Ordinance 2010-075 which approves and authorizes the City's purchase of electricity supply for the Recreation & Senior Center from FirstEnergy Solutions Corp. through agreement with the Sourcing Office, a Council of Governments; and authorizes the Mayor to execute an affiliate cooperative purchasing agreement with the Sourcing Office and a customer supply agreement with FirstEnergy Solutions Corp. for this purpose, without public bidding be recommended for suspension and adoption by substitution. This Ordinance requires a unanimous affirmative vote for adoption. Mr. Kilo stated they have had the opportunity to negotiate with FirstEnergy Solutions. The electric rate for the Recreation Center, Service Center and the Police facility are the facilities that use over 700,000 kilowatt hours a year. This agreement will save roughly \$230,000.00 over a three year period for the three facilities. This Ordinance is being amended to include all three facilities and not just the Recreation Center.

Finance Committee: Chairman Dooner stated Ordinance 2010-078 which is making appropriations for current expenses and other expenditures for 2010 and repealing 2010-044 be recommended for suspension and adoption.

Planning, Zoning and Engineering Committee: Chairman Patrick Coyne recommended suspension and adoption for Resolution 2010-083 which is confirming Planning Commission's approval of the site plan for an addition to Strongsville Co-Op preschool. Resolution 2010-084 which is advertising for bids for the Shurmer Road culvert project was also recommended for suspension and adoption. Ordinance 2010-090 which in regards to grants of easements for access to utilities and a city pumping station for various uses involving Ledgewood Association be placed on first reading and be referred back to Planning Commission and the Committee.

Public Safety and Health Committee: Chairman DeMio recommended suspension and adoption for Ordinance 2010-085 which is entering a contract for food service for the Police jail facility.

Committee of the Whole: Chairman Gallagher recommended suspension and adoption for 2010-076 which is the levying of special assessments for the Webster Road sanitary sewer project. Ordinance 2010-077 which is enacting section 1046.243 of the Codified Ordinances to establish charges for any connections directly or indirectly to the Webster Road sanitary sewer project was recommended for suspension and adoption. Ordinance 2010-086 which authorizes the Mayor to enter into a contract with Southwest General Health Center for the levy of a tax for the maintenance and support as compensation for use of the facility was recommended for suspension and adoption. Resolution 2010-087 which is declaring the amount of taxes that may be raised by a levy within the ten (10) mill limitation and without a vote of the electors be insufficient be recommended for suspension and adoption. Resolution 2010-088 which is supporting the passage of the Health Center renewal levy was recommended for suspension and adoption. Lastly, Ordinance 2010-089 which is involving a settlement and release agreement with the Ledgewood Association in connection with land use matters be placed on first reading and referred back to the Committee. Ordinance 2010-091 was an add-on Ordinance and it is ratifying and authorizing the Mayor to apply for and accept funding from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources for the little league baseball fields and to complete a public recreation area. The recommendation for this was suspension and adoption.

Economic Development and Technology Committee: Chairman Daymut stated that the Councilman should have received in their packet an invitation by Mayor Perciak and Colliers International for a special showing for our Technology Park and if any Councilman could make it that day the city is trying to market our property as much as we can. Chairman Daymut gives Brent Painter a lot of credit-he is the one that has been following through with Colliers to make sure we have the most exposure we can have. Chairman Daymut stated he will give the rest of the report on the floor. Mayor Perciak stated we have over twenty RSVPS' already for this event.

President Gallagher asked if any of the directors had anything to discuss with Council. Building Commissioner Tony Biondillo stated regarding the group home (at 20058 Hawthorne Lane) and Northcoast Community Homes that is going to own the home that they will not be the care provider; it will be Our Lady of the Wayside or one of the other providers. The Building Department sent them a letter and a notice indicating that the stipulation/regulations we have concerning the property. Mr. Biondillo distributed the letter in response from the company regarding this to the Councilmen. In summary, they agreed to do everything the city has asked them to do. The home will operate as the other home on Idlewood and the ones in other areas are.

Mr. Biondillo stated they were sent over an Action Request concerning Surrarrer Elementary school. Last week he contacted Bob Martin of the school system and he relayed that the work in question was done sometime between 2002 to 2004 which was before he came on board. The fence in back of the property is actually the property of the school and was on school property. It was decided to remove the fence at that time and within their budget they do not have plans of replacing it in the near future. Councilman Roth stated that was sad because for thirty years the fence was there in order to keep five hundred kids out of the homeowner's backyards and now they decide to take it down.

City Engineer Ken Mikula stated the work on Drake is on schedule and they have given them 60 days which comes up at the end of July. Mr. Mikula also stated he gave notice to all members of Council regarding the closing of Main Street and that is going to start the second week in June and last until just before school starts. Service Director Joe Walker stated work is being done at the RR crossings on Albion Road this week and they should be done with that crossing on Wednesday. As long as they are doing what they're doing, they are also going to do Marks Road, Fair Road and Main Street but we don't know the dates on any of those yet; usually a two day notice is given. Notice will be given to Council as fast as possible regarding these streets. Albion Road should be open by Wednesday or Thursday of this week.

Mr. DeMio asked the Mayor if he knew what they were doing with Allen Elementary and if they had a dedicated day set for its demolition. The Mayor stated that he knew nothing as of yet. The Mayor stated a new business manager is coming in and he really doesn't have an answer in regards to anything else. Mr. DeMio stated that this affects Strongsville football leagues in regards to their little league games there, baseball teams, etc. It also will really affect Ward 2. Mr. DeMio asked the Mayor to keep Council updated if he hears anything because he is having discussions with the residents that live over in that area.

Motion by Mr. DeMio, second by Mr. Daymut, to adjourn from open session into executive session [Article XI, Section 9, City Charter] to discuss collective bargaining matters. Roll Call: All ayes. Motion carried. Council convened in executive session at 7:43 p.m. with the following members present: Coyne, Daymut, DeMio, Dooner, Gallagher, Haseley and Roth. Also present were Mayor Perciak, Law Director Kraus, Finance Director Dubovec and Human Resources Director Urankar. A motion to conclude the Executive Session was made by Mr. DeMio and seconded by Mr. Roth. All members present voted aye and the motion carried. The executive session concluded at 7:59 p.m.

REPORTS OF COUNCIL COMMITTEES:

SOUTHWEST GENERAL HEALTH SYSTEM – Mr. Gallagher: I attended the last meeting-just a re-hash of the success of the Tiara...Mayor, I don't know if you want to comment on that a little. It was for the emergency room.

Mayor Perciak – The emergency room, the gross receipts for the Tiara Ball this year thanks to the generosity of so many of our sponsors and out of all our participants were \$328,000.00 Mr. President.

SCHOOL BOARD – Mr. Roth: Thank you Mr. Gallagher. I attended a May 20th meeting and at that meeting recognition was given by Mr. Lampert for a perfect score on the ACT test of a 36 by Mahima Venkatesh, a junior at the High School-grade 11. She had a perfect score on her ACT. That's amazing. The Ohio Athletic Trainer's Association Award went to Kim Blackburn, the head trainer at the High School. An Outstanding Educators Awards were given to Ms. Angela Corrigan, Ms. Mary Deighton, Mr. Jason Frederick, Ms. Sheri Martin, Ms. Kristin Russ, and Ms. Robyn Suit. They were given like I said Outstanding Educator Awards. I think a little footnote, Leslie; I want you to send a little response note back to Mr. Morton that the residents in the vicinity around Surrarrer would really like the fence that was taken down along the entrance sidewalk to Surrarrer put back for safety reasons. It was there for over thirty years until it came down in 2004 or 2005. There's been nothing but problems since-I would just like to see them put that back to seal off the entire student body from people's backyards. That's all.

PUBLIC SERVICE AND CONSERVATION – Mr. Haseley: Thank you, Mr. Gallagher. First item under this Committee is Ordinance 2010-069. It's a-we have to amend by substitution, suspend and adopt as amended. Its additional charges for additional work the best way I can describe it-necessary work. Ordinance 2010-079 is to allow the Mayor to file for additional funding for a worthwhile project-suspend and adopt. Resolution 2010-080 is to advertise for bids for various streets improvements-suspend and adopt. Resolution 2010-081 is to accept a donation of \$8,170.00 from Strongsville City Club to the Service Department for vehicles. We thank them-recommendation is to suspend and adopt. Lastly, Resolution 2010-082 is a simple of transfer of burial rights in Strongsville Municipal Cemetery-recommendation is to suspend and adopt. That concludes my report. I'll answer any questions if there are any?

Mr. Gallagher – Thank you, Mr. Haseley. Questions for Mr. Haseley?

Mr. Roth – I promised the residents I would voice this issue-there's four or five homes on-five homes on Westwood that have a problem with what's going on in a little creek north of Westwood and they would like to see a...hopefully maybe a co-op effort to remove a lot of the debris from that creek. It's being used as a public storm water system and there are also concrete slabs in there. Maybe we can as a co-op with the residents get that cleared up. There's been eighteen to twenty feet of a dramatic erosion; suddenly there's been a bridge put across rather unorthodox way from residential land to industrial land and the problem they have is not really that the bridge itself is going to block the creek- it's that it's very flimsy, it's supported only by 4 X 4's in water. When that collapses, and eventually it will, it's going to be the perfect dam and there's a lot of concern there because that's the same creek that when it didn't flow property gave Atlantic and a lot of homes in the area flooding problems. There also was an attempt, and the residents stopped it, by the industrial side on the north to put a twenty-four inch storm sewer in the creek which would have really restricted that creek and the residents went out there and confronted those workers and stopped that so I'd like to just see the city be put on guard against doing something like that. The residents also questioned whether there were permits for the bridge and that twenty-four inch pipe. Thank you Mr. Gallagher.

Mr. Gallagher – Thank you Mr. Roth. Any other questions?

Finally, we have Ordinance 2010-090, it's a grant of easement for sanitary for Ledgewood Association and quit claim deed of two parcels to the Association in connection with the settlement and release agreement. We're going to place that on first reading and refer it to Planning, Zoning, and Engineering...and Planning Commission- thank you Mr. Kraus. That's all I have. If there are any questions I'd be more than happy to answer them.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TECHNOLOGY – Mr. Daymut: Thank you, Mr. Gallagher. We do no Ordinances or Resolutions on this evening's agenda. I gave a brief report on our meeting on Monday, May 24th. We did review our breakfast meeting, May 20th was very well attended and we appreciate that. We especially appreciate Southwest General Health Center for sponsoring that breakfast. Our feature speaker was Steve Campbell, Chief of Staff for the Ohio Department of Transportation who took time out of his busy schedule to tour the city and to determine and to see the needs that we have as far as infrastructure goes as far as ODOT is concerned. Our next business breakfast meeting will be September 23rd. We're in the process of gathering a sponsor and speaker for that particular breakfast. We are also accepting nominations for innovation awards that will be presented at that particular meeting. We did not receive a Tech Committee report from Ed Oliveros but I would like to report that he was in Dallas, TX for the Wind/Energy Conference out there and we look forward to getting his report at our next meeting. As you know, there will be some here installed in Lake Erie. A bus tour here for my Committee will be scheduled for September or October to tour our industrial land. Our small business seminars sub-committee gave a report and that is in conjunction with the Chamber of Commerce and that will be held in October or November. More information will be forthcoming on that. I believe there will be something in the Chamber newsletter. This month. We also discussed the Strongsville Business Park on 169 acres. I'd like to thank the Mayor, Brent Painter and Colliers International. There will be an exclusive showing of the Strongsville Business and Technology Park on June 23rd at 8:00A.M. where the Foltz extension now ends. Any businesses interested in locating or if anyone knows of anyone interested in locating in our industrial park on the land that we own we would appreciate that there would be some response to that. Any of my colleagues that could make that would also be-we would appreciate it. The Strongsville Community Foundation will become active in the fall. We will talk about the beautification of Strongsville. We received a business update and our next meeting will be Monday, May 28th at 7:00P.M. (**the meeting is actually June 28th**) here in at the Communications Center. That's all we have Mr. Gallagher. Thank you.

BUILDING AND UTILITIES – Mr. Gallagher: Before Building this evening we have Ordinance 2010-075 and that's an Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to purchase electricity for Service Center, Police Station and Recreation Center at a substantial savings to the City- recommendation is going to be to adopt but first we have to amend by substitution, suspend it as amended and adopt as amended. That's all I have, any questions regarding that?

Mr. Gallagher – Mr. Roth.

Mr. Roth – Within this Committee just one more issue. Back on the previous one as far as Westwood, I just want to submit these pictures showing the blockage and the eighteen feet of erosion. I would really appreciate some responses on several of those points...the bridge, the support of the bridge, things of that nature there on those points I brought up previous. Also, my point here within this Committee is the Hickory Branch extension...and I appreciate the promise and the response by the Building Commissioner to address the dust and the debris that's there but I just want to state that for the first couple weeks of that project the metal plates that were on in the middle of the street-those were really loud bangings going on in the middle of the night and early in the morning waking people up and disturbing the peace. That was a real problem there at the first week or two. Also, the first couple of weeks there was several reports to me, and I believe Mr. DeMio that they were starting before 7:00A.M. and especially on weekends when 8:00A.M. and 9:00A.M. is appropriate by Ordinance and we just can't have that every time there's a major project. We're not talking about tapping and hammers; we're talking about backhoes, graders and dump trucks making a street. Starting before 7:00A.M. on weekends was a big problem and those banging plates were a big problem and I hope that's rectified and I really kind of hope it doesn't happen again.

Mayor Perciak – Mr. President and Mr. Roth.

Mr. Roth – Yes.

Mayor Perciak – First of all, Assistant Chief James Kobak is here to address the noise issue. Assistant Chief Kobak?

Deputy Chief Kobak – Councilman Roth in that memo stated we were down there a number a times but did not observed any violations, however we promise that we would monitor the situation from here on out.

Mr. Roth – This was early-I haven't been getting complaints lately. I haven't been getting complaints but early on-

Mayor Perciak – We're aware of that Mr. Roth and the Assistant Chief has been monitoring that and will continue to monitor it so the residents can-if they have an issue just ask them to please call the Police Department and we will have somebody there pronto. Now, as far as the plates and everything, Ken Mikula our City Engineer has some answers for you there.

Mr. Roth – Ok.

Mr. Mikula – I'm not sure if you're aware, if you've been down there since last week, but those plates have been removed and that concrete has been repaired on a temporary basis with asphalt until the developer is going to pour concrete and repair it more permanently and I believe I memo'd you on that last week.

Mr. Roth – Yes.

REPORTS OF COUNCIL COMMITTEES (cont'd):

Mr. Mikula – With regard to these photos, I was out at this site this afternoon and met the property owner. I believe I related that earlier that the slabs that are shown along the creek here are his and his responsibility and he has indicated that he was going to remove that himself.

Mr. Roth – Yes.

Mr. Mikula – Ok.

Mr. Roth – The City is using that as a public storm water system and it's never been cleaned so he'd like to see that dredged a little bit also so it flows better instead of eroding. He's changed the location of his fence three times. Also, I realize on both cases, the plates on the noise, I realize it's over with by the lack of phone calls to me early in the morning and late at night, but what I'm saying we as Councilman and as residents, they had to endure a couple of weeks of pain there while the banging in the street did occur and while the starts were before 7:00A.M. We came out of the blocks bad.

Mr. Mikula – Actually, the plates were-the concrete was in pour condition before the project started and has the trucks were moving through the site, it deteriorated worse and they put it in a safe condition by putting the plates there. The reason they took a little while to remove the plates and replace it with asphalt was because they were up against the availability of the asphalt, the time of the year, and the weather. All of that has been taken care of now and it was taken care of as fast as possible so it was put in a safe condition by plating it so that people could drive over it and now it's been taken care of and repaired.

Mr. Coyne – Mr. Gallagher.

Mr. Gallagher – Mr. Coyne.

Mr. Coyne – I received two calls on that issue too, I think Mr. DeMio did. It was on the weekend and I contacted Tony Biondillo, the Mayor and Joe Walker all by phone and I called the residents back. It was taken care of a few days later so I would like to thank them because they called me on Saturday and it was taken care of the beginning of the week. I appreciate it. I think Mr. DeMio didn't you get the same call.

Mr. DeMio – Yes, I did and the one thing that I appreciate Mr. Walker is handling the early start because when I got the call at 7:00A.M.-you know, when you get an early call you always think the worst, you don't know who the call is coming from and especially on a weekend. I appreciate your promptness. I think they understand that Mark, myself, Pat, the Mayor and the staff did things as quick as humanly possible based on that and I appreciate it. I know Mark I left a message on your recorder as soon as I got the call as well.

Mr. Roth – Mr. Gallagher.

Mr. Gallagher – Mr. Roth.

REPORTS OF COUNCIL COMMITTEES (cont'd):

Mr. Roth – I want to make it clear I appreciate Mr. Walker and the Police Department's response too. I'm just hoping that in the future that maybe the timing could be a little bit better as far as putting two plates together and for a few days keeping everybody up and for a few days having this big equipment keep everybody up early in the morning. Months-the residents started to get the message to call the Police and once I was notified and you were notified yes they responded quickly and I'm thankful for that. That's all Mr. Gallagher.

Mr. Gallagher – Ok. We're good?

Mr. Walker – Mr. Gallagher, I'm just thankful I didn't get one more call from a Council member; it would have been a bust in the Sunshine Law.

(Laughter)

Mr. Walker – I appreciate that.

Mr. Gallagher - If there's anybody that can maneuver around the Sunshine Law that would be sunshine Joe Walker. Thank you Joe, we appreciate it.

Mr. DeMio – He is getting a tan Mike.

Mr. Gallagher – Any further questions?

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE – Mr. Gallagher: We have Ordinance 2010-076-it's establishing charges for Webster Rd. sanitary sewer project, assessments for improvements-recommendation is suspension and adoption. Ordinance 2010-077 is also establishing charges for the sanitary sewer project for additional connections to lots which were not assessed earlier-suspension and adoption is the recommendation. Ordinance 2010-086 is authorizing the Mayor to enter into a contract with Southwest General Hospital regarding the renewal of the levy-recommendation is suspension and adoption. Follow up on that is Resolution 2010-087-it's the ballot language for Southwest General-suspension and adoption. Resolution 2010-088 is support of Southwest General Hospital renewal levy-recommendation is suspension and adoption. Finally, Ordinance 2010-089-we're going to place that I believe on first reading. That's all I have for Committee of the Whole. Are there any questions?

MAYOR PERCIAK: Thank you Mr. President. I have several items to talk about this evening or to share information about. First of all, I'd like to thank the Strongsville City Club for their very generous donation of approximately \$8,100.00. They have agreed to buy for us two special event vehicles that we use around the commons for the Rib Burnoff and for the Strongsville Chamber of Commerce Homecoming so I want to thank everybody at the City Club anteing up the \$8,100.00. That helps a great deal when we're trying to put these-when everyone is trying to help each another put these events on.

Mayor Perciak (cont'd) - Tagging along on that, I'd like to inform all of our residents in our business community that the Strongsville City Club Rib Burnoff will be held Thursday, June 24th, Friday, June 25th and Saturday, June 26th on the commons again. Please come and have a good time. There will be plenty of good food for all to eat and new recreational activities there for the children. Again, that's the 24th, 25th, and 26th of June.

Also, on behalf of all of us here, the Administration, the City Council, we extend sincere congratulations to our own Veterans of Foreign Wars right here in Strongsville-our post here on Strongsville Boulevard will be celebrating their 75th anniversary on Saturday, June 19th at noon. Again, congratulations to our veterans, to our organization here in Strongsville that does so much to help us remember what-how many dedicated men and women have given their lives to our country. Thank you VFW and thank you for your seventy-five years of service to the veterans and to the City of Strongsville. Also, along with the VFW, 10:30 this morning June 9th State Senator Tom Patton will present the Keeling family, Marine Corporal Tom Keeling, the deceased Marine Corporal who was killed in Iraq five years ago a Resolution dedicating a strip of I-71 in the name of Corporal Tom Keeling. That will take place this Wednesday, at 10:30A.M. at the VFW post on Strongsville Boulevard so we look forward to seeing as many of you there as possible.

Moving on to saving money again and our ability to obtain money and to obtain grant dollars, I'd like to thank Steve Kilo our Recreation Director for helping us negotiate a \$227,000.00 savings over three years on our three city buildings- the Recreation Center, the Service Center and our Police Department. That is Ordinance 2010-075 tonight. This is huge ladies and gentlemen when we have this type of cooperation between the Administration and Council to bring home savings on utilities, especially CEI-I got that wrong, I stand corrected, FirstEnergy Solutions on these three buildings. Now, in addition to that, I don't want anybody to forget the challenges that our ahead of us with FirstEnergy and rate increases. I've asked our Economic Development Director Brent Painter to stay in front of this issue so that we can keep this issue live in front of the Governor's office and the PUCO. With the electricity rates continuing to go up and with especially here in the Midwest most of our electricity is generated by coal. Their anticipating ten percent annual increases there so we really need to stay ahead of this. You need to write the Governor. You need to keep this in front of Senator Tom Patton and make him aware as to how important it is. By the way, Tom Patton has been on the right side of this issue right from the beginning when the majority of the State Senate voted for it, Senator Patton voted no so he's is on our side. We have got to keep this-we must be a strong voice to make certain we keep electric rates down because as you can see, we all suffer with these electric rates, not just the homeowner. It's kind of like a trickle down effect.

Moving on to a grant that we received through the help of Senator Tom Patton for our aquatic area. In order to do anything with that we have to relocate some of our baseball fields. State Representative Matt Patten was able to negotiate with our friends in Columbus to help us move that money over to our youth sports park on Lunn Road so that we can build three brand new youth baseball diamonds there where it all belongs. That of course is in front of the Council tonight under Resolution 2010-091, so a lot of activity going on. We could not get that done without the help of our State Senator Tom Patton and our State Representative Matt Patten.

**REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE MAYOR, DIRECTORS OF DEPARTMENTS

Mayor Perciak (cont'd) -When you see them, thank them because this money is coming directly from the State to the City of Strongsville to provide recreation for our five to twelve year old children and it will help us-it will help over two thousand young men and women play baseball right here in our city in a very confined, safe area. Steve, thank you for working with them and President Mr. Gallagher thank you for staying in front of this with the State Senator and with Matt Patten. This was a true team effort in order to get this done and without all this help, believe me, it would not have happened. Joe Walker, you're guys when we get started on this we're going to need all their help to make certain that this all comes to fruition.

Moving along, all the other things that are going on in town. The Main Street bridge, you know, you're going to see that that is going to close beginning June 11th. Why is it going to close? Our county engineers agreed to replace that Main Street area there-that Main Street bridge so that will close beginning June 11th and will remain close for approximately sixty days, I think that is correct. This is a huge savings to the City of Strongsville that that will be fixed. I want to thank our County Engineer for working with us on that. That continues along with the CSX closings. We hope to have the Albion Road one done by the end of this week then we will be moving on to the next closing. Watch our website or our government station for the next site that will be closed. We want to get all-as many of these sites done before the weather changes on us.

Last but not least I announced in the spring a grant from the Ohio Public Works Commission for the extension of our sanitary sewers on Drake Road east to the city line. We have the official letter from the Ohio Public Works Commission entitling the City of Strongsville to \$452,048.00 for the beginning of that project. This ladies and gentlemen goes directly to the homeowner's on that street and will result in substantial savings for the connection of all our sanitary sewer lines there. That is the end of my report Mr. President.

LAW DEPARTMENT – Mr. Kraus: Yes, Mr. President, just a few announcements this evening. One small piece of good news; as a result of the litigation pending with respect to the sewer district storm water program the sewer district has stipulated that any imposition of the storm water fee that they had proposed to start on July 1st will be continued and delayed until at least October 1st of this year. We have at least a three month reprieve if you will with respect to that fee. There's some other matters pending in that case that may yet impact on the imposition of that fee and/or the timing of that fee. I would also like to report that the city's Records Commission will be meeting this Wednesday at 9:30 in the morning in the Mayor's conference room. There will be five or six city departments that will be presenting their records retention schedules and their schedules for disposition of records in accordance with law. I would also like to report that just today, the city was served with a notice from the Ohio Department of Natural Resources that there has been an application filed for construction and installation of an oil and gas well in the City of Strongsville at 11022 Webster at the Belarusian Community Center facility and land approximately 21.3 acres that they have there. There will be a pre-permitting site review process in accordance with state law. This is mainly regulated by state law and our Fire Chief and other city officials are permitted to participate and I understand will participate in that process so that we can do everything that we can locally here in Strongsville from a safety standpoint with respect to any permitting that is issued by the State of Ohio to an oil and gas well here. Finally, I would like to report that all ordinances and resolutions on this evening before City Council are in proper legal form.

Mr. Gallagher – Thank you Mr. Kraus. Questions for Mr. Kraus?

Mr. DeMio – Yes, I would like to ask for the exact of the location of that gas and oil well from Albion Middle School. I'd like to get that.

Mr. Kraus - President, Councilman DeMio, that's something that the-we do have a drawing that they just filed today, we just received all this paperwork today from Columbus. It's already been forwarded to the Fire Chief, the Mayor and other city officials. One of the things-in fact the Fire Chief mentioned to me while we were sitting in the caucus this evening was that he wants to take a look at the measurements with respect to the school so that's something that will be certainly reviewed and will be past on to you and other members of City Council.

Mr. DeMio – Mayor, if you could, could you call a meeting on that with all of Council when you gave a good understanding about where they stand.

Mayor Perciak – Absolutely.

Mr. DeMio – I really appreciate it. I don't want to speak for you but I have a feeling I know that many of opinions have yet to change.

The State continues to control all the drilling of these oil wells and all we can do is follow the format that is available to us and that's what we're going to do.
