ORDINANCE NO. 2023 - 008

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 1258.05 AND 1258.08 OF TITLE SIX OF PART TWELVE OF THE PLANNING AND ZONING CODE OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, CONCERNING MOTORIST SERVICE DISTRICTS AND AREA REGULATIONS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That existing Section 1258.05 of Chapter 1258, of Title Six of Part Twelve Planning and Zoning Code, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Strongsville, be and is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

1258.05 USE REGULATIONS; MOTORIST SERVICE DISTRICT.

Buildings and land shall be used and buildings shall be designed, erected, altered, moved or maintained in whole or in part in Motorist Service Districts only for the uses set forth in the following schedules and regulations:

(a) Main Buildings and Uses Permitted.

(1) <u>Service Stations</u>. Service stations for the sale of fuels, oil, lubricants, batteries, tires, and other automotive accessories to the motoring public. Such facilities may include facilities for servicing and minor repair of vehicles and the retail sales of merchandise in accordance with the provisions of Section 1258.14.

(2) <u>Lodging facilities</u>. Motel accommodations for the traveling public. A game room or amusement arcade may be permitted within lodging facilities only if a conditional use permit is granted in

accordance with standards set forth in Section 1242.07.

- (3) Eating and drinking establishments. Restaurants, snack bars, taverns, drive-in restaurants as individual establishments or in conjunction with a lodging or indoor tennis facility permitted in this District. A game room or amusement arcade may be permitted within eating and drinking facilities only if a conditional use permit is granted in accordance with standards set forth in Section 1242.07. An outdoor eating area adjacent to and as an accessory use to the main building may be permitted provided a conditional use permit is granted in accordance with the standards set forth in Section 1242.07 of the Zoning Code.
- (4) <u>Automotive service centers.</u> Automotive Service Centers in accordance with the provisions of Section 1258.14.

(5) Indoor tennis facility.

(6) <u>Fueling Stations</u>. Fueling stations for the sale of fuel and convenience goods to the motoring public. Such facilities may include the sale of food and beverages for carry out and/or on premises consumption. Outdoor display or sale of merchandise shall only be permitted as specifically authorized by Planning

Commission as part of development plan approval. Outdoor eating areas may be permitted provided a conditional use permit is obtained in accordance with Section 1242.07.

- (7) Recreational vehicle sales and service. Motorcycle, boat, snowmobile and outboard motor sales and service, provided the use is located within a free-standing building and all testing facilities and operations are conducted within an enclosed building; and
- (8) <u>Automotive sales</u>. Automotive, truck, van and recreational vehicle sales, leasing, renting and related services, including accessory repair and service garages, provided such uses are within a free-standing building; and new and used automotive, truck, van and recreational vehicle sales lots, provided such uses are in conjunction with a permitted vehicles sales use located on the same lot as the free-standing building used for the sale of new motor vehicles.

(9) Auto Washes and Auto Wash Facilities.

(b) Similar Main Uses Permitted. Any other motorist service facility or service not listed above or in any subsequent use classification and determined as similar by the Planning Commission in accordance with the standards set forth in Section 1242.08 of this Zoning Code; and

(c) Accessory Uses Permitted.

- (1) Off-street parking and loading facilities as required in Chapter 1270 of this Zoning Code;
- (2) Signs in Motorist Service Districts shall be designed, erected, altered, reconstructed, moved and maintained, in whole or in part, in accordance with the type, design size, location, illumination and other provisions set forth in Chapter 1272 of this Zoning Code; and
- (3) The sale and/or exchange of propane canisters not exceeding twenty (20) pounds capacity as an accessory use at Fueling Stations, Service Stations, and Recreational Vehicle Sales and Service Facilities provided a conditional use permit is obtained in accordance with Section 1242.07.

Section 2. That existing Section 1258.08 of Chapter 1258, of Title Six of Part Twelve Planning and Zoning Code, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Strongsville, be and is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

1258.08 AREA REGULATIONS.

In all Business Districts, buildings and land shall be used, and buildings shall be designed, erected, altered, moved or maintained in whole or in part, only in accordance with the following schedule:

Section 3. That in case of conflict between any provision of this Ordinance and any other ordinance or resolution, or part thereof, the provisions of this Ordinance shall prevail and apply, unless a conflicting provision is deemed to be more restrictive.

Section 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5. That this Ordinance is hereby declared an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary in order to provide for the proper development of lots and lands within the City and to enhance economic development within the City. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE ADOPTED BY SECTION 1250.03 OF TITLE SIX, PART TWELVE OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF STRONGSVILLE TO CHANGE THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF CERTAIN REAL ESTATE LOCATED ON PEARL ROAD, IN THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, FROM GB (GENERAL BUSINESS) CLASSIFICATION TO MS (MOTORIST SERVICE) CLASSIFICATION (PORTION OF PPN 397-10-005), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the Zoning Map of the City of Strongsville, adopted by Section 1250.03 of Title Six, Part Twelve of the Codified Ordinances of Strongsville, be amended to change the zoning classification of certain property located on Pearl Road, in the City of Strongsville, from GB (General Business) classification to MS (Motorist Service) classification (portion of PPN 397-10-005), which property is more fully described in Exhibit A, and depicted in Exhibit B, all attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

- **Section 2.** That the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized to cause the necessary changes on the Zoning Map to be made in order to reflect the changes in zoning classification as provided in this Ordinance.
- **Section 3.** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- **Section 4.** That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and further to afford the applicant an opportunity to submit plans to facilitate economic development within the City, and to assure proper development of all lots and land within the City. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.



FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT FOR PUBLIC SAFETY DISPATCH SERVICES BETWEEN THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, OHIO AND THE CITY OF BROOK PARK, OHIO

THIS FOURTH AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT made at Strongsville, Ohio, this 24 day of ______, 2023, by and between the CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, Ohio, hereinafter designated as "Strongsville", and the CITY OF BROOK PARK, Ohio, hereinafter designated as "Brook Park".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, through adoption of Ordinance No. 2018-074 on May 21, 2018, the Strongsville City Council authorized an Agreement with the City of Brook Park for public safety services; and

WHEREAS, through adoption of Ordinance No. 11024-2018 on May 15, 2018, the Brook Park City Council likewise authorized an Agreement with Strongsville for such public safety services; and

WHEREAS, on May 23, 2018, Strongsville and Brook Park entered into an *Agreement for Public Safety Dispatch Services*, in which Strongsville agreed to dispatch Brook Park Police Department and Fire Department calls, on a twenty-four (24) hour basis, to authorized personnel of the Brook Park Police Department and the Brook Park Fire Department and other public safety resources (such as animal control) generally with regard to emergency and non-emergency incidents, and with communication support and services/systems directly related to the dispatch function, and subject to other specific terms and conditions contained therein; and

WHEREAS, at that time, Brook Park agreed to certain terms and conditions in connection with payment to Strongsville for Strongsville's provision of such Dispatch Services; and

WHEREAS, for the year 2019, there was no adjustment to the amount paid by Brook Park, from the rate of pay set forth in the Agreement between the parties; and

WHEREAS, on January 6, 2020, the parties entered into a *First Amendment to Agreement* providing for an adjustment to the provision for payment based upon the first year of operations and consistent with the Agreement, and as authorized by Strongsville City Council in Ordinance No. 2020-003; and

WHEREAS, additionally, on January 4, 2021, the parties entered into a *Second Amendment to Agreement* providing for an adjustment to the provision for payment based upon two (2) years of operations and consistent with the Agreement, and as authorized by Strongsville City Council in Ordinance No. 2021-002; and

WHEREAS, for the year 2022, the parties entered into a *Third Amendment to Agreement* providing for an adjustment to the provision for payment based upon three and one-half (3 ½) years of operations and consistent with the Agreement; and as authorized by Strongsville City Council in Ordinance No. 2021-150; and

WHEREAS, now based upon four and one-half years of operations and in accordance with provisions of said Agreement, it is now necessary to further amend the provision relating to payment for Dispatch Services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants set forth in the Agreement and herein, it is agreed as follows:

1. Article I(E) of the Agreement be and is hereby amended to read in part as follows:

* * *

"E. Payment for Dispatch Services: Brook Park, in consideration of the provision of the Dispatch Services outlined herein, agrees to pay Strongsville the amount of Forty-Three Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-Three Dollars and 33/100 (\$43,333.33) per month by the first (1st) of each month for Dispatch Services provided in that month. For the period of operation from January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020, Brook Park will pay Strongsville at an increased rate of pay of Forty-Five Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty-Three and 33/100 Dollars (\$45,933.33) per month by the first of each month for Dispatch Services provided in that month, for a total of Five Hundred Fifty-One Thousand One Hundred Ninety-Nine and 96/100 Dollars (\$551,199.96) for such year of operation. For the period of operation from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021, Brook Park will pay Strongsville at an increased rate of pay of Forty-Eight Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-Nine and 32/100 Dollars (\$48,689.33) per month by the first of each month for Dispatch Services provided in that month, for a total of Five Hundred Eighty-Four Thousand Two Hundred Seventy-One and 84/100 Dollars (\$584,271.96) for such year of operation. For the period of operation from January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, Brook Park will pay Strongsville at an increased rate of pay of Fifty-Two Thousand Nine Hundred Seventeen and 00/100 Dollars (\$52,917.00) per month by the first of each month for Dispatch Services provided in that month, for a total of Six Hundred Thirty-Five Thousand Four and 00/100 Dollars (\$635,004.00) for such year of operation. For the period of operation from January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, Brook Park will pay Strongsville at an increased rate of pay of Thousand Ninety-Two and 00/100 Fifty-Six (\$56,092.00) per month by the first of each month for Dispatch Services provided in that month, for a total of Six Hundred

Seventy-Three Thousand One Hundred Four and 00/100 Dollars (\$673,104.00) for such year of operation."

- This Fourth Amendment to Agreement amends, modifies and supplements the 2. Agreement effective January 1, 2023 only as specifically set forth herein. All rights and obligations of Strongsville and Brook Park under the Agreement and all other provisions not specifically amended herein remain unmodified and in full force and effect.
- This Fourth Amendment to Agreement shall be binding upon Strongsville and Brook Park and their respective successors and assigns.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023 – <u>024</u>

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING ADDITIONAL MEMBERSHIP OPTIONS, PAYMENT PROCEDURES AND NEW MEMBERSHIP FEES FOR THE WALTER F. EHRNFELT RECREATION AND SENIOR CENTER TO BE EFFECTIVE MARCH 1, 2023, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, in order to provide residents, guests and members of the Walter F. Ehrnfelt Recreation and Senior Center more flexibility, the City of Strongsville will be establishing four (4) different membership options and payment procedures; and

WHEREAS, additional membership fee options for current military members, veterans and their families will be implemented, along with various other new membership fees; and

WHEREAS, this Council is desirous of implementing all of the said changes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, AND STATE OF OHIO:

- **Section 1.** That effective March 1, 2023, there will be established four (4) different membership options and payment/billing plans and procedures, all as set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein, which shall be applicable and operative for membership in and for the use of the Walter F. Ehrnfelt Recreation and Senior Center facilities.
- **Section 2.** That effective March 1, 2023, various new membership fee options for current military members, veterans and their families, daily guest fees and daily guest pass booklets will be implemented, also as set forth in the attached Exhibit A.
- **Section 3.** That the foregoing membership options and fee rates are subject to the following additional specific adjustments:
- (a) A refund of a full or partial membership fee may be issued by the Director of Recreation & Senior Services in the event that the Director determines that there is an emergency affecting the member or involving the facilities.
- (b) Any question as to fees to be charged in an individual situation interpreting and/or applying this Ordinance, or in a situation arguably not fully covered by this Ordinance, shall be resolved by a decision of the Director of Recreation & Senior Services or the Mayor by considering the most analogous fee set out herein. The decision of the Director of Recreation & Senior Services or Mayor shall be final. The Director of Recreation & Senior Services may require documentation reasonably necessary to prove any status claimed under the terms of this Ordinance, including but not limited to proof of residency.
- (c) Notwithstanding the above, the Mayor, upon recommendation of the Director of Recreation & Senior Services, may establish a program of discounts which may include discount coupons, additional months of free membership, or other reasonable and limited incentives to encourage new memberships and/or renewal of memberships.

Section 3. That the provisions of this Ordinance shall be operative from and after March 1, 2023.

Section 4. That any ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with any of the provisions of this Ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed effective March 1, 2023.

Section 5. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 6. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that the additional membership options and fees are necessary in order for the financial viability of the Recreation and Senior Center facility, and to conserve funds. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

<u>Senior Couple</u> means two individuals who are living in the same residence, one of whom is at least 60 years of age and the other who is at least 50 years of age.

<u>Military/Veteran</u> means an individual who is an active member or veteran of any United States military service and provides proof of veteran status (DD214) or for active members, a military ID.

Resident means an individual who is legally living within a permanent residence in the City of Strongsville.

-Any adults wishing to qualify for a Couple, Senior Couple, or Family membership who do not share the same last name, each MUST provide independent proof of residency upon application.

-Memberships are non-refundable and non-transferable.
