AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING MAP OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE ADOPTED BY SECTION 1250.03 OF TITLE SIX, PART TWELVE OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF STRONGSVILLE TO CHANGE THE ZONING CLASSIFICATION OF CERTAIN VACANT PROPERTY LOCATED ON MARKS ROAD, IN THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, FROM GI-A (GENERAL INDUSTRIAL-A) CLASSIFICATION TO RT-C (TOWNHOUSE-CLUSTER) CLASSIFICATION (PORTION OF PPN 394-07-001), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA, AND STATE OF OHIO:

- **Section 1.** That the Zoning Map of the City of Strongsville, adopted by Section 1250.03 of Title Six, Part Twelve of the Codified Ordinances of Strongsville, be amended to change the zoning classification of certain vacant property located on Marks Road, in the City of Strongsville, from GI-A (General Industrial-A) classification to RT-C (Townhouse-Cluster) classification (portion of PPN 394-07-001), which property is more fully described in Exhibit A, and depicted in Exhibit B, all attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- **Section 2.** That the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized to cause the necessary changes on the Zoning Map to be made in order to reflect the changes in zoning classification as provided in this Ordinance.
- **Section 3.** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees; that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- **Section 4.** That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and further to afford the applicant an opportunity to submit plans to facilitate economic development within the City, and to assure proper development of all lots and land within the City. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.



PETITION FOR ZONING CHANGE

Ordinance Number: 2023-07/ To the Council of the City of Strongsville, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio: I/We, the undersigned owner(s) of the property set above our names on the Property Description Form attached to this document, hereby petition your Honorable Body that said property be changed from a class GIA use to a class RT-C use. Such change is necessary for the preservation and enjoyment of a substantial property right because: Subject property is currently zoned for General Industrial or Sexual-Oriented Businesses. Seeing as Tractor Trailer truck traffic is not permitted on Marks Road, the property owner is faced with a practical difficulty in marketing the property to Industrial Users. It is impractical to think an Industrial Business could successfully operate on Mark Road without the need for substantial trucking. Additionally, Sexually-Oriented Businesses would be obtrusive and inconsistent with the neighboring residential uses on Marks Road. Such change will not be materially detrimental to the public welfare nor to the property of other persons located in the vicinity because: <u>Proposed zoning change will not be detrimental and</u> exhibits proper planning and "step-down" zoning practices. The zoning change to a higher-density, residential use, under common ownership, would act as a buffer between adjacent Industrial & Manufacturer Businesses and lower-density, rural residential zoning district. This document is intended to serve as a supplement to Pride One Construction's application for a rezoning certificate on behalf of Granger Property Development (or its assignee) ("**Applicant**"). Applicant is seeking a rezoning use permit from the City of Strongsville to permit Applicant to develop, construct, market, lease and operate a 90-unit Cluster Community, on the real property located in the City of Strongsville known as parcel no. 39407001.

Applicant believes there is a strong need for high-end rental housing in the City of Strongsville. The proposed 90-Unit Community will provide the necessary housing for those wanting to downsize, while continuing their residency in the City of Strongsville. Applicant has been working in close consultation with Pride One Construction ("Pride One") on the type of clusters which would be designed, constructed, operated, and maintained to be harmonious and appropriate in appearance with the existing character of the general vicinity, and that such use will not change the essential character of the area. The proposed Community will require a great deal of focused effort on building and landscaping aesthetics. For this reason, Pride One has continued a long-term partnership with MPG Architects, whose designs and material selections have proven to stand the test of time. Landscaping throughout the community will be lush, with a diverse mix of tree selections, seasonal color plantings and stormwater retention basins with aeration fountains installed for visual appeal. To provide a superior experience for residents, there will be full-time maintenance and leasing staff onsite. Residents will be able to request maintenance assistance for items as miniscule as changing a light bulb. The applicant takes great pride in the fact that their build to rent product allows tenants to live like single-family homeowners by including individual trash service, secluded rear patios and private, two-car garage entries for each dwelling. Pride One has built an excellent reputation as a general contractor with almost 30 years' experience in building high quality projects—including over 10,000 residential units.

The product Applicant intends to build is not the type of community most people have in mind when they think of rentals. Applicant intends to build both single-story and two-story clusters which look and live more similarly to a residential development than a standard rental complex. The design of these clusters, with individual, attached garages for each dwelling unit, are very attractive to empty nesters, young professionals, and seniors looking to age-in-place within the City of Strongsville.

The proposed clusters have been thoughtfully crafted to encompass Fair Housing Act of 1995 (FHA), Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) and American Nation Standards Institute (ANSI) design elements including, but not limited to:

- Private, Zero-Step (Level) Entries to Each Dwelling Unit
- Accessible routes from each unit to ALL Common Space Areas and Amenities (i.e. Accessible Parking, Sidewalks, Leasing Office, Club House, Recreation Facilities, Mail Kiosk, etc.)
- "Usable" Interior Doors; providing an accessible route into and through the dwelling unit.
- Accessible Light Switches, Electrical Outlets, Thermostats and Environmental Controls
- Reinforced Restroom Walls in Each Dwelling Unit, allowing for the installation of grab bars around toilets, sinks, tubs, and shower stalls upon tenant's request.
- "Usable" Kitchens and Restrooms in Each Dwelling Unit; providing proper maneuvering space between countertops, fixtures, and appliances with equipment controls at appropriate elevations.

This type of Build to Rent Community integrates seamlessly with neighboring residential communities and will not be hazardous or disturbing to existing or future neighboring uses. Newly constructed clusters with a fresh design could potentially add value to properties in the vicinity and to the community. To minimize impact to adjacent property owners, Applicant intends to create natural buffering and screening along shared property lines by adding densely planted trees and shrubs.

The Proposed Use will utilize and extend existing, public water and sanitary facilities through the approval of Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District ("NEORSD") and Cleveland Water. Aside from public utilities and the City of Strongsville Emergency Response Teams (Police, Fire, EMS), the remaining community will be privately serviced and maintained by the Applicant, including roadways. Applicant will be solely responsible for street plowing, road repairs, landscaping maintenance, etc.

The Proposed Use will not involve uses, activities, processes, materials, equipment and conditions of operation that will be detrimental to any persons, property, or the general welfare by reason of excessive production of traffic, noise, smoke, fumes or odors. The Proposed Use shall provide residential housing units for tenants. All maintenance equipment and supplies shall be properly stored within a locked maintenance garage. Street and building façade lighting will be meticulously designed by MPG Architects, to avoid any light pollution or light spill-over into adjacent parcels. While the tenant's safety is of the utmost concern, Applicant understands that too much lighting within the community can be obtrusive and bothersome to both tenants and neighbors alike.

The clusters which Applicant intends to construct, will have vehicular approaches to the property which will be designed to not interfere with traffic on surrounding streets or roads. Sufficient off-street parking banks will be provided, in addition to each dwelling unit having its own private 2-Car (or 1-Car), an attached garage and 2-Car (or 1-Car) driveway. Applicant proposes one point of ingress and egress to/from the Community which is subject to review by ODOT and Cuyahoga County. If deemed necessary by ODOT, City of Strongsville and/or Cuyahoga County, a traffic study will be performed by a Licensed Engineer.

WHEREAS, in accordance with Article X of the City Charter and as required by law, the Mayor and the City Council President have appointed a Charter Review Committee; and

WHEREAS, the Committee has reviewed and recommended to City Council certain amendments to Article III, Section 12 of the City's Charter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS (2/3) OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF CONCURRING:

Section 1. That pursuant to Article XVIII, Section 9 of the Ohio Constitution and Article IX, Section 2 and Article X of the Charter of the City of Strongsville, this Council hereby authorizes and directs the submission to the electors of the City of Strongsville, at a regular November election to be held at the usual places of voting in said City on Tuesday, November 7, 2023, the following proposal to amend the Charter of the City of Strongsville, Ohio:

That in order to provide that Council shall post on the website of the City, and in public places in the City determined by Council, all ordinances, resolutions, statements, orders, proclamations, notices and reports required by law.

Section 12 of Article III of the City Charter shall be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE III THE COUNCIL

SECTION 12. PROCEDURE.

All legislative action shall be by ordinance or resolution except when otherwise required by the Constitution or the laws of the State of Ohio. The Council shall keep a journal of its proceedings which shall be a public record. The vote shall be taken by ayes and nays, which shall be entered upon the journal; and no ordinance or resolution shall be passed without the concurrence of a majority of the members elected to Council. The Council, through passage of an Ordinance, may establish a consent agenda. Every ordinance or resolution shall be read or read by title on three different days unless two-thirds (2/3) of the members elected to Council dispense with the rule.

All ordinances, resolutions, statements, orders, proclamations, notices and reports required by law, by this Charter or by ordinance to be posted, shall be posted on the website of the municipality and in not less than five (5) of the most public places in the Municipality, as determined by Council, for a period of not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the taking effect thereof, subject to the exceptions set forth in Section 13 hereof, or in such other manner as Council may hereafter determine by ordinance, resolution or order.

(Amended 11-2-04.)

Section 2. That if the foregoing proposal receives the affirmative vote of a majority of the electors voting thereon, then existing Section 12 of Article III shall be and the same is hereby repealed and replaced by the new Section 12 of Article III.



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, NOT LESS THAN TWO-THIRDS (2/3) OF ALL MEMBERS THEREOF CONCURRING:

Section 1. That pursuant to Article XVIII, Section 9 of the Ohio Constitution and Article IX, Section 2 of the Charter of the City of Strongsville, this Council hereby authorizes and directs the submission to the electors of the City of Strongsville, at a regular November election to be held at the usual places of voting in said City on Tuesday, November 7, 2023, the following proposal to amend the Charter of the City of Strongsville, Ohio:

That the City Council may appoint a person to act in its stead as its designee to the Planning Commission for a term of two years.

Sections 5(a) and 5(b) of Article IV of the City Charter shall be amended to read as follows:

ARTICLE IV ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICES

SECTION 5. PLANNING COMMISSION.

(a) <u>Membership</u>. The Planning Commission shall consist of seven (7) members: the Mayor; one member of Council or a person appointed by Council to act in its stead as its designee; and five (5) members appointed by the Mayor subject to the approval of a majority of the members elected to Council. Appointed members shall hold no other municipal office or appointment. The Mayor shall have the right to remove any appointed member he or she has appointed for cause. The Council shall have the right to remove the member it has appointed for cause.

(b) <u>Terms of Office</u>. Present members of the Planning Commission shall continue to serve until their terms are completed. Members may succeed themselves. The term of members appointed by the Mayor shall be for four (4) years. The term of the member appointed by Council shall be two (2) years.

Section 2. That if the foregoing proposal receives the affirmative vote of a majority of the electors voting thereon, then existing Sections 5(a) and 5(b) of Article IV shall be and the same are hereby repealed and replaced by the new Sections 5(a) and 5(b) of Article IV.

Section 3. That it is the desire of the Council that the ballots for said question shall be in substantially the following form:

PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.

Shall Sections 5(a) and 5(b) of Article IV of the City Charter be amended to provide that City Council may appoint a person to act in its stead as its designee to the Planning Commission for a term of two years?

Section 4. That the Clerk of Council is hereby authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County no later than August 9, 2023.

Section 5. That the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County shall cause an appropriate notice to be duly given of the regular election to be held on November 7, 2023 on the foregoing amendment to the Charter of this City, and otherwise to provide for such election in the manner provided by the general laws of the State of Ohio.

Section 6. That the Clerk of this Council is hereby authorized and directed to cause the full text of such proposed Charter amendment to be published once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Strongsville, with the first publication to be made at least fifteen days prior to the election to be held on November 7, 2023, or to mail a copy of such proposed Charter amendment to each elector whose name appears in registration books of the last general or regular municipal election held in the City at least 30 days prior to the November 7, 2023 election, all as provided in Article XVIII, Section 9 of the Constitution of the State of Ohio, in Section 731.211 of the Ohio Revised Code and Article IX, Section 2 of the City Charter.

Section 7. That there is hereby appropriated from the General Fund a sufficient sum of money to pay the costs of carrying out the authorizations and directives of this Ordinance.



Dear Mr. Jamison:

Enclosed is the ms consultants/HDR modification request for additional design services for the improvements to 'B' Plant, 'C' Plant and the Westwood Lift Station. As you are aware, the project scope has increased considerably due to the condition of the facilities, code requirements and safety improvements needed at all three locations. The construction value of the proposed improvements is approximately six times greater than originally anticipated when the Request for Qualifications was issued and the proposal was prepared in June 2020, and the design and estimated construction durations have increased as well. The design schedule has more than doubled based on the additional scope of services.

The additional scope items were incorporated into the project for the following reasons:

- 1. Condition Assessment
 - a. Items identified to be deficient and in need of replacement; less than 5% remaining useful life;
 - b. Essential equipment to the treatment process and could increase potential for permit violations if not addressed;
 - c. Likely to require above and beyond routine Operations and Maintenance (O&M).
- 2. Code Compliance
 - a. Items identified that do not comply with current code regulations;
 - b. National Fire Protection Association (NFPA 820) Wastewater Treatment Regulations.
- 3. Owner Request
 - a. Items that require above and beyond normal routine O&M;
 - b. Address Life Safety concerns for operational staff;
 - c. Increase operational reliability;
 - d. Address flooding issues at 'C' Plant.

The following is a list of scope items that were incorporated into the project:

1. Condition Assessment:

- a. Emergency Generator at Westwood Lift Station (LS)
- b. Main Service Disconnect at Westwood LS
- c. Main Switchboard at Westwood LS

 - xi. Replace additional solids handling process piping due to internal condition
 - xii. Increase capacity and relocate biogas flares at both WWTPs
- b. Site property research and survey at 'C' Plant
- c. New retaining wall system and sampling access platform planning and design for operator safety at 'B' Plant
- d. Evaluation and design of ferrous bulk storage tank cover
- e. Evaluate and design wet well mixing system at 'C' Plant
- f. Evaluate generator fuel reserve at 'B' Plant

The additional scope items are attached for your review in Exhibit A-1. Please note that with this modification request of \$772,428, the ms consultants/HDR team is still well below common industry-accepted values for design services compared to percentage of construction cost. Additionally, the scope of the project delivery increased from two design packages and one bid package to three design packages and three bid packages, and sheet counts for the total project have more than doubled. Based on the revised scope, the updated estimated construction cost between the three bid packages is approximately \$33.5 million. A typical range for a project of this type is 6-10% of the construction value for design services. With this modification, we will be at approximately 4.6% for design. The following is a summary of the modification request, further described in Exhibit B1:

Understanding

The City of Strongsville solicited engineering design and consulting services for the rehabilitation of two (2) wastewater treatment plants (WWTP), and the Westwood Lift Station. The services are to include preliminary design, detail design, bidding, construction administration and construction inspection. The two WWTPs, known as WWTPs B and C, were expanded in 1984-85 and have nearly identical treatment processes. WWTP B has an average design flow (ADF) of 2.1 MGD and is gravity fed. WWTP C has an ADF of 1.8 MGD and has an influent lift station. The Westwood Lift Station has a peak flow capacity of 9.4 MGD and was built around 1970. All three of these facilities are contract operated by Veolia (Operator).

Both of the plants are similar with each having four (4) rectangular primary clarifiers with preaeration basins, Rotating Biological Contactors (RBCs) for secondary treatment, four (4) rectangular secondary clarifiers, and four (4) Parkson DynaSand Filters.

The original scope and fee anticipated the completion of an early blower package (excluding bidding and construction services), and a final design package for both plants and the Westwood Lift Station, with a total anticipated construction cost of approximately \$7 million with a total construction duration of approximately 14 months. During preliminary design and the condition assessments at all facilities, the scope of the project was increased due, primarily, to age and condition of the infrastructure, flooding concerns, necessity to meet current building and National Fire Protection codes, and the need for additional safety improvements at all three facilities. The construction cost estimate for the improvements increased to approximately \$40 million spread between three separate projects:

- 1. 'C' Plant Blower and Washer Compactor Replacement
- 2. Westwood Lift Station Improvements
- 3. Wastewater Treatment Plants 'B' and 'C' Improvements

The anticipated construction schedule also more than doubled from the original estimated 14 months. These changes also necessitated a 7-month increase in design duration and creation of multiple bid packages for solicitation of contractors. The following is a list of additional tasks that were added in addition to the original scope of services:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE BY INTERNET AUCTION, OF CERTAIN OBSOLETE PROPERTY NO LONGER NEEDED FOR ANY MUNICIPAL PURPOSE BY THE CITY'S SERVICE DEPARTMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

- **Section 1.** That this Council finds that the Service Department of the City of Strongsville is in possession of a certain vehicle, which is obsolete, surplus, has little monetary value, and is no longer needed for any municipal purpose, as more particularly described in Exhibit A, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, and further finds, therefore, that it will be in the best interest of the City that such property be sold by public internet auction through GovDeals.
- **Section 2.** That pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 721.15, the City is authorized to sell or dispose of property by internet auction; and that, pursuant to Article IV, Section 3(e) of the City Charter, the Mayor and Director of Finance be and are hereby authorized to dispose of such obsolete tangible property identified in Exhibit A and to perform all acts required in furtherance thereof.
- Section 3. That the Director of Finance and the Mayor, therefore, are authorized to retain the services of GovDeals to effectuate the sale of such obsolete property by internet auction through an appropriate user agreement between the City and GovDeals, and in a form to be approved by the Law Director; and that the Director of Finance, Mayor and the Director of Public Service be and are further authorized and directed to execute all documents and perform all acts required to complete the sale of such obsolete and unneeded property by public internet auction.
- **Section 4.** That the public internet auction will be conducted through GovDeals in accordance with its rules, regulations and procedures, including listing of the obsolete and unneeded property for sale by auction to the public on the internet. That as required by law, the property will be listed for ten (10) days, including Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays.
- **Section 5.** That the net proceeds of the operation of this Ordinance shall be deposited into the Street Construction, Maintenance & Repair Fund; and any funds required for the purposes of this Ordinance have been appropriated and shall be paid from the Street, Construction, Maintenance & Repair Fund.
- **Section 6.** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 7. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that the immediate sale of such obsolete and unneeded municipal property is necessary in order to provide necessary storage space for the Service Department, to enable the Department to replace obsolete equipment, and to conserve public funds. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE RATIFYING, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND DIRECTOR OF RECREATION & SENIOR SERVICES TO SUBMIT A PROPOSAL TO RECEIVE FUNDING FROM THE CUYAHOGA COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES, DIVISION OF SENIOR AND ADULT SERVICES, THROUGH ITS COMMUNITY SOCIAL SERVICES PROGRAM (CSSP), IN CONNECTION WITH VARIOUS CITY SENIOR PROGRAMS, FUNCTIONS, AND TRANSPORTATION FOR 2024 AND 2025; AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF ANY REQUIRED AGREEMENT AND DOCUMENTS RELATED THERETO; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this Council, through Ordinance Nos. 2015-247, 2016-172, 2018-069 and 2021-098 authorized the Mayor and Director of Recreation & Senior Services to submit proposals and receive funding from the Cuyahoga County Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Senior and Adult Services, in order to provide senior developmental activities for its senior members; and

WHEREAS, Cuyahoga County has once again issued a Request for Proposal (RFP #12756) on behalf of its Division of Senior and Adult Services, soliciting proposals from agencies and organizations interested in providing 2024 Community Social Services Programs (adult development and transportation services) to Cuyahoga County; and

WHEREAS, the City of Strongsville's Department of Senior Services regularly offers and provides such services to its senior members; and

WHEREAS, the County's Community Social Services Program would provide reimbursements to the City for certain adult development activities now offered free to Strongsville Senior Center members relating to adult development and transportation trips for total funds in the approximate amount of \$282,800.00 for the years 2024 and 2025; and

WHEREAS, the City's Department of Senior Services has a need to provide and fund such senior developmental activities for its senior members; and

WHEREAS, the Council and City Administration, therefore, are desirous of again submitting a proposal to Cuyahoga County in order to participate in funding for the above senior adult developmental activities for the City's Senior Center.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That this Council hereby ratifies and approves that the Mayor and Director of Recreation & Senior Services submit a proposal for and accept funds in the approximate amount of \$282,800.00 for the years 2024 and 2025 from the Cuyahoga County Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Senior and Adult Services, through its Community Social Services Program, to assist the City of Strongsville's senior adult developmental programs, including adult development and transportation, as more fully set forth in the

Request for Proposal on file with the City's Director of Recreation & Senior Services; and further authorizing the Mayor to execute any required Agreement, and to further provide, execute and deliver such other information as may be required in connection therewith.

That the Mayor, the Director of Finance, Director of Recreation & Senior Services and/or their designees be and are hereby authorized to do any and all other things necessary to perform the terms and conditions required by Cuyahoga County in this regard and in accordance with their respective responsibilities thereunder.

Section 3. That any funds required to meet the City's obligation, if any, under this Ordinance and the Request for Proposal will be appropriated and paid from the Multi-Purpose Complex Fund.

Section 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that it was immediately necessary to timely submit a proposal and be awarded such funding in order to continue and enhance the senior adult-related programs of the City's Department of Senior Services, and to conserve public funds. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2023 - 113

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE FOR FUNDING FROM NOACA THROUGH THE ENHANCED MOBILITY FOR SENIORS AND INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM, FOR THE PURCHASE OF A VEHICLE TO PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION SERVICES FOR THE CITY'S SENIOR WHEELS PROGRAM; AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Strongsville Department of Recreation & Senior Services coordinates with the City of Berea, and other agencies, to operate the Senior Wheels program, which provides transportation services for the elderly and persons with disabilities who reside within those communities; and

WHEREAS, the Senior Wheels program has documented a need to replace a vehicle for use in its transportation services; and

WHEREAS, therefore, the City of Strongsville is desirous of applying for funding to replace such vehicle, from the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (NOACA) for Cleveland Urbanized Area Federal Transit Administration (FTA) funding from the Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program (Section 5310); and

WHEREAS, NOACA is designated recipient of the Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities (Section 5310) program for the Cleveland Urbanized Area, authorized to make grants to public bodies, private nonprofit organizations, and other eligible entities; and

WHEREAS, the Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities program provides eighty percent (80%) federal funds for capital projects to support alternatives to public transportation projects that assist seniors and individuals with Disabilities, new or expanded transportation services and alternatives that go beyond the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 for individuals with disabilities; and

WHEREAS, the Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities program is paid on a reimbursement basis requiring the applicant to first expend funds then request reimbursement from NOACA, which will, in turn, request the funds from FTA; and

WHEREAS, the City of Strongsville certifies it will provide local matching funds for capital or planning projects from sources other than federal Department of Transportation funds; and

WHEREAS, the City of Strongsville agrees to abide by federal requirements as a sub-recipient of FTA funds, including federal fiscal year 2015 Certifications and Assurances inclusive of provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and all subsequent annual Certifications and Assurances during the length of the agreement, including federal procurement, maintenance, useful life, disposition standards, and ongoing reporting; and

WHEREAS, the City of Strongsville is authorized to execute a contract with NOACA if selected for the Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That this Council hereby approves the filing of an application with NOACA for Cleveland Urbanized Area Federal Transit Administration funding from the Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program (Section 5310), on behalf of the City of Strongsville for funding for a new vehicle, as more fully set forth in the application on file in the office of the Director of Recreation & Senior Services; and further authorizes the Mayor, Director of Finance, Director of Recreation & Senior Services and/or their authorized representatives to provide, execute and deliver certifications, assurances and such other information as may be required in connection therewith.

Section 2. That the funds necessary to carry out the purposes of this Ordinance, and to pay the City's share, have been appropriated and shall be paid from the Multi-Purpose Complex Fund.

Section 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to approve the filing of the application in order to continue the Senior Wheels program and to provide an adequate vehicle for transportation service for the elderly and individuals with disabilities, and to conserve public funds. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
