AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1252.36 OF TITLE SIX OF PART TWELVE-PLANNING AND ZONING CODE OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE IN CONNECTION WITH PROHIBITED USE OF SHIPPING AND/OR STORAGE CONTAINERS IN RESIDENTIAL DISTRICTS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 1252.36 of Title Six of Part Twelve-Planning and Zoning Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Strongsville be and is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

1252.36. PROHIBITED USES.

- Notwithstanding anything in this Chapter 1252 to the contrary, the sale or manufacture for sale of a firearm, firearm components, deadly weapons, ammunition for a firearm, explosive device, incendiary device, ballistic knife, dangerous ordnance, or explosive is prohibited in all Residential Districts. The terms set out in this Section 1252.36 shall have the same meaning as the defined terms set out in Ohio Revised Code Section 2923.11 in effect on the date of the passage of this Ordinance, or as subsequently amended or modified in the Ohio Revised Code. (Ord. 2008-244. Passed 3-2-09.)
- Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in Chapters 1252, 1253 and (b) 1254, shipping and/or storage containers, including but not limited to railway cars and containers carried by trucks and ships, are not permitted as main nor accessory uses or any components thereof in any Residential District.
- Section 2. That in case of conflict between any provision of this Ordinance and any other ordinance or resolution, or part thereof, the provisions of this Ordinance shall prevail and apply, unless a conflicting provision is deemed to be more restrictive.
- Section 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 4. That this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 266.03(a) OF CHAPTER 266 OF TITLE SIX OF PART TWO-ADMINISTRATION CODE OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE CONCERNING VACATION LEAVE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 266.03(a) of Chapter 266 of Title Six of Part Two-Administration Code of the City of Strongsville be and is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 266.03(a) VACATION LEAVE, SICK LEAVE AND HOLIDAYS.

Except for part-time elected officials and all less than full-time employees including regular part-time, seasonal or temporary employees, and those employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement, each full-time employee of the City shall be provided with vacation leave, sick leave and holidays as follows:

- (a) <u>Vacation Leave</u>. Each full-time City employee shall be entitled to paid vacation leave on his or her anniversary date as follows:
 - (1) After completion of one year and up to five years of continuous service, two weeks with pay;
 - (2) After completion of five years and up to ten years of continuous service, three weeks:
 - (3) After completion of ten years and up to fifteen years of continuous service, four weeks;
 - (4) After completion of fifteen years and up to twenty years of continuous service, five weeks;
 - (5) After completion of twenty or more years of continuous service, six weeks;
 - (6) Compensation in lieu of vacation must receive prior written approval of the Mayor.
 - (7) The City, may at the sole discretion of the Mayor, award a non-collectively bargained employee who, at the time of being hired by the City, and having prior public service experience, additional vacation upon hire in recognition of the newly-hired employee's prior years of public service credit. The effective date of this amendment shall be retroactive to January 1, 2022.

Section 2. That the within amendments shall be operative and effective as to applicable City employees upon passage and approval of this Ordinance.

- **Section 3.** That any funds required for the purposes of this Ordinance shall be appropriated and paid from the General Fund; Police Pension Fund; Street, Construction, Maintenance & Repair Fund; Fire Levy Fund; Fire Pension Fund; Multi-Purpose Complex Fund; Community Diversion Fund; Earned Benefits Fund, and/or Sanitary Sewer Fund.
- **Section 4.** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- **Section 5.** That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to properly provide for benefits to various employees; and to conserve public funds. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 266.03(a) of Chapter 266 of Title Six of Part Two-Administration Code of the City of Strongsville be and is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

SECTION 266.03(a) VACATION LEAVE, SICK LEAVE AND HOLIDAYS.

Except for part-time elected officials and all less than full-time employees including regular part-time, seasonal or temporary employees, and those employees covered under a collective bargaining agreement, each full-time employee of the City shall be provided with vacation leave, sick leave and holidays as follows:

(a) <u>Vacation Leave</u>. Each full-time City employee shall be entitled to paid vacation leave on his or her anniversary date as follows:

(1) After completion of one year and up to five years of continuous service, two weeks with pay;

(2) After completion of five years and up to ten years of continuous service, three weeks;

(3) After completion of ten years and up to fifteen years of continuous service, four weeks;

(4) After completion of fifteen years and up to twenty years of continuous service, five weeks;

(5) After completion of twenty or more years of continuous service, six weeks;

(6) Compensation in lieu of vacation must receive prior written approval of the Mayor.

(7) The City, may at the sole discretion of the Mayor, award a non-collectively bargained employee who, at the time of being hired by the City, and having prior public service experience, additional vacation upon hire in recognition of the newly-hired employee's prior years of public service credit. The effective date of this amendment shall be retroactive to January 1, 2022.

(8) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Section 266.03(a), the City may, at the sole discretion of the Mayor, award a non-collectively bargained employee who retires from the City and is rehired by the City, not more than ten (10) days of vacation leave in the employee's first year after being re-hired. After the first year, the re-hired non-collectively bargained employee shall be entitled to vacation leave as set forth in Sections 266.03(a)(1) – (5).

Section 2. That the within amendments shall be operative and effective as to applicable City employees upon passage and approval of this Ordinance.

Section 3. That any funds required for the purposes of this Ordinance shall be appropriated and paid from the General Fund; Police Pension Fund; Street, Construction, Maintenance & Repair Fund; Fire Levy Fund; Fire Pension Fund; Multi-Purpose Complex Fund; Community Diversion Fund; Earned Benefits Fund, and/or Sanitary Sewer Fund.

Section 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

- **Section 3.** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.
- **Section 4.** That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to contract for professional services with an owner's representative in order to proceed with the Town Center Initiative Project, and to conserve public funds. Therefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
