Pearl Road to be Repaved North of Turnpike

The final of section of Pearl Road in Strongsville will be resurfaced in 2019 as part of a major project that will run through three communities.

The Strongsville section, from the Turnpike bridge north to the city limits, will be only a small portion of the \$12 million project, which will repave Pearl north to nearly Snow Road, through Middleburg Heights and Parma Heights.

About 80 percent of the project cost is expected to be paid by state and federal grants. The construction will continue the repaving of Pearl in Strongsville that ran from the Turnpike bridge south to Shurmer and wrapped up in the summer of 2016. It's estimated Strongsville will have to pay about \$317,00 for its share.

Middleburg Heights is the lead agency on the project.
