Community Gardeners Share the Bounty

hen the city created a Community Garden a few years back, it was designed to be a place where residents without space at home could cultivate vegetables or flowers.

Now, it's blossomed into a little community of its own. Gardeners who tend plots there have joined together to share their bounty with their neighbors.

One group of volunteers cuts flowers and arranges bouquets every week, which they deliver to local nursing homes and assisted living centers to lift the spirits of patients and staff.

Another group takes vegetable donations — and tends two 'donation plots' at the garden — and delivers them to the city's four fire stations every week.

It will feature all types of household items, collectibles, toys, glassware and more.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection is Aug. 27-28

he final Household Hazardous Waste Collection of the year is set for Aug. 27 and 28 at the Service Center, 16099 Foltz Parkway.

Residents can drop off their household products 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. each day.

Materials accepted include oil or solvent-based paint (no latex paint), varnish, mineral spirits, caustic household cleaners, adhesives, gasoline, sealers, polyurethane, herbicides, automotive fluids, roof tar, lighter fluid, primers and coatings, shellac, pesticides, motor oil, driveway sealer,

mercury, paint thinner, turpentine, fungicides, car batteries and kerosene. LATEX PAINT IS NOT ACCEPT-ED. To dispose of latex paint, dry up the paint (leave the lid off or mix in a drying agent like kitty litter) and leave it out with your regular trash with the lid removed.

Businesses on the Move

Work continues on the new **Dunkin'** on Pearl Road at the site of the former Village Motel. The property owner sought and received approval to rezone the parcel to accommodate the coffee shop/restaurant.
