Grocery Outlet eyes Strongsville site

discount grocery chain that is making inroads in the Cleveland area has set its sights on a store in Strongsville.

Grocery Outlet, which bills itself as an "extreme value retailer," has submitted plans to the city Building Department to remodel the Staples store at 12421 Pearl Road into a supermarket.

The plans are under review and have not yet been approved.

It would join several other discount grocery store here, including Aldi and Marc's south of Royalton Road, and Walmart north of Royalton.



Grocery Outlet operates more than 400 stores across the nation — including locations in Parma, Brooklyn and Cleveland Heights — and is the largest extreme value in the U.S.

It features brand name grocery products on the shelves,

Many of the stores are run by independent operators, which are local residents who own and operate the store with support from the parent company.

It will be open 4 to 7 p.m. on Tuesdays through Sept. 9.

Household Hazardous Waste Collection is Aug. 26-27

The final Household Hazardous Waste Collection of the year is set for Aug. 26 and 27 at the Service Center, 16099 Foltz Parkway.

Residents can drop off their household products 7:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. each day.

Materials accepted include oil or solvent-based paint (no latex paint), varnish, mineral spirits, caustic household cleaners, adhesives, gasoline, sealers, polyurethane, herbicides, automotive fluids, roof tar, lighter fluid, primers and coatings, shellac, pesticides, motor oil, driveway sealer,

mercury, paint thinner, turpentine, fungicides, car batteries and kerosene. LATEX PAINT IS NOT ACCEPT-ED. To dispose of latex paint, dry up the paint (leave the lid off or mix in a drying agent like kitty litter) and leave it out with your regular trash with the lid removed.
