Year-End Rundown: New Food, Retail in Strongsville

Strongsville again saw its share of new restaurants open during this past year.

The city has a rich history of hosting eateries with a variety of cuisines.

In 2024, several eateries opened or announced plans to operate here:

Nourishing Nook is a new coffee shop on Pearl Road, offering beverages, food and a place to relax.

Honeygrow, a stir fry restaurant, oened on Royalton Road.

Kyuramen, a Japanese ramen restaurant, is opening at SouthPark Mall — the first in Ohio.



Dunkin' built a new coffee shop and restaurant on the north end of Pearl Road.

El Taco Macho is soon to open on Pearl Road, offering authentic Mexican street food.

Original Pancake House has announced it will take over the Rico's site on Pearl Road at Shurmer Road, offering breakfast and lunch daily. Another Broken Egg, which serves breakfast and lunch, will be taking over the O'Charley's spot on Pearl Road.

The owners of SouthPark Mall have also said they are working with restaurants to take over the Macaroni Grill and Red Lobster buildings but have not disclosed the names. An announcement is expected soon.

Don't Be a Victim this Holiday Season: Strongsville Police

Thieves are out in force over the holidays, taking advantage of crowds of distracted shoppers.

Police say you should:

Guard your wallet — Make sure your purse is zipped or snapped shut, and never put it in a shopping cart. Pickpockets can reach inside in a flash. Men should carry wallets in a front pocket or zipped jacket pocket.

Don't leave stuff in the car

— Bags of merchandise are too tempting for a thief. Put your purchases in the trunk.

Shut out thieves at home — Burglars know you have gifts in your house. Make sure your doors and windows are locked, and leave lights on. Don't leave valuables in your

car, and lock your car doors.

Don't give till it hurts — Fake charity scams are everywhere this time of year. Double check before donating.
