## Memorial Day Parade and Ceremony Set

The annual Memorial Day parade and ceremony will return this year on Monday, May 31.

The parade will step off at 11 a.m. from St. Joseph Church and head south on Pearl Road to Zverina Lane. It will end at the Freedom Trail Gazebo with a short ceremony.

Mayor Tom Perciak will be among the speakers.

The event is sponsored by Strongsville VFW Post 3345 to honor the nation's fallen military heroes.

Masks will be required and social distancing enforced.

## Hungry? Lots of New Restaurants on the Way

By this summer, there will be a number of new dining choices in Strongsville, some of them new to the region.

Pho & Beyond will open a Vietnamese restaurant in the former Goldie's location at Pearl and Westwood.

Farther south on Pearl, Cosmic Dave's Subs will have a sandwich shop next to NAPA Auto Parts.

In the Royalton Collection, the newest restaurant will be Hot Chicken Takeover, which specializes in Nashville hot chicken.

Construction is starting on the new Arby's, which will



take over the former Mad Cactus site on Pearl and Whitney.

Work is continuing on Barrio, the taco shop renovating the former Molly McGhee's on Prospect.

And Freddy's Frozen Custard and Steamburgers is taking over the former Burger King

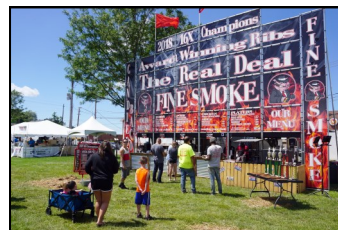
restaurant on Pearl Road. Renovations are currently under way.

Also, the former Rockne's location on Royalton at Howe is expected to become a Seafood Shake restaurant, which offers authentic Cajun seafood and currently operates an eatery in Cleveland Heights.

## Rib Burnoff Dates Change; Now Set for August

The Strongsville City Club's annual Rib Burnoff is set for Aug. 12-14 on the City Commons.

The popular event did not take place last year due to the coronavirus epidemic. Usually scheduled for June, it will run two months later this year.



It will feature an array of award-winning ribs, plus plenty of side dishes and beverages. There will also be live

entertainment each evening.

Strongsville's regular events were nearly all cancelled last year, but are returning in 2021. That includes Homecoming, which will take place July 14-17 on the Commons, featuring rides, games, food and live bands, and ending with a fireworks show.

## Drop Off Household Hazardous Waste May 4-6

The first of the two 2021 Household Hazardous Waste Collections is set for May 4-6 at the Service Center, 16099 Foltz Parkway.

Residents can drop off their household products 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. any of the three days.



Materials accepted include oil or solvent-based paint (no latex paint), varnish, mineral spirits, caustic household cleaners, adhesives, gasoline, sealers, polyurethane, herbicides, automotive fluids, roof tar, lighter fluid, primers and coatings, shellac, pesticides, motor oil, driveway sealer, mercury, paint thinner, turpentine, fungicides, car batteries and kerosene.

**LATEX PAINT IS NOT ACCEPTED.** To dispose of latex paint, leave the lid off to dry up the paint — or mix in a drying agent available at home improvement stores — then place it out with your regular trash for collection. **ALSO NOT ACCEPTED:** Rechargeable batteries and fluorescent bulbs, including CFLs.
