In particular, Smeader was recognized for his actions when the ambulance he was riding in was struck, leaving the driver unconscious. Smeader was able to get the vehicle off the road before also losing consciousness.



Dispatcher Angela Love brought "a vast amount of experience, a jaw-dropping work ethic and a wonderfully sunny disposition" to Southwest Emergency Dispatch Center, her nominating letter says.

Love is always willing to help, from answering someone else's phone to offering to switch shifts, and often volunteers to do extra jobs.

Police Officer Mike Mendise's compassion and professionalism were evident when he climbed over a safety fence on the Boston Road overpass to talk to a woman threatening to jump. Mendise was able to calm the woman and take her to safety.

Here's the Fall 2021 Leaf Collection Schedule

Strongsville's Service Department will pick up leaves in October and November.

Here's the schedule:

If you live NORTH of Royalton Road, crews will be in your area the weeks of Oct. 18 and Nov. 1

If you live SOUTH of Royalton Road, crews will be by the weeks of Oct. 25 and Nov. 8.

You should have your leaves piled near the curb (not in the road or ditch, and no more than 4 feet from the street) on the FIRST day of the collection week. Do not bag leaves, and please remove branches, rocks, metal and other items that could damage pick-up equipment. Additional collections may be added.

Branches should be bundled in 3-4 foot lengths and put out with your regular trash.

Businesses on the Move

Gopuff has opened a storefront on south Pearl Road, but the public is not invited inside. The business is delivery only, where shoppers can order snacks, alcohol and other items online and have it delivered in minutes.

Two new restaurants are seeking to open at the Greens of Strongsville. **Blue Habanero**, which has a popular Mexican restaurant in Cleveland, will open in the former B Spot location. And **Szechuan Gourmet**, which also has a Cleveland location, will open in the former Zoup! spot.

Dollar General has opened a retail store at 17900 Pearl Road, next to the former Family Video.
