A RESOLUTION ADOPTING ALTERNATIVE TAX BUDGET INFORMATION FOR THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, OHIO FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 5705.281 of the Ohio Revised Code, the Cuyahoga County Budget Commission has waived the requirement that the City of Strongsville adopt a tax budget as provided under Sections 5705.28 and 5705.30 of the Revised Code, and has required the City of Strongsville to provide alternative tax budget information in order for the Commission to perform its duties under law; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Director of Finance, therefore, have prepared alternative tax budget information for the City of Strongsville, Ohio, for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2015; including a Division of Taxes Levied setting forth levies inside and outside the 10 Mill limitation, inclusive of debt levies; a Statement of Fund Activity; Unvoted General Obligation Debt; Voted Debt Outside of the 10 Mill Limit; and Schedule of Interfund Transfers, all for submission to the Cuyahoga County Budget Commission and Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That the alternative tax budget information for the City of Strongsville, Ohio, for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2015, heretofore prepared by the Mayor of this City and submitted to this Council, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof as if fully rewritten herein, be and the same is hereby ratified, approved, confirmed and adopted as the official alternative tax budget information of the City of Strongsville for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2015 and ending December 31, 2015 for submission to the Cuyahoga County Budget Commission and Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer.

Section 2. That the Clerk of Council be and is hereby authorized and directed to promptly certify and transmit a copy of said alternative tax budget information and a copy of this Resolution to the Cuyahoga County Budget Commission and Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer.

Section 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 4. Background

Substitute House Bill No. 129 (HB129) effective June 3, 2002, was enacted by the 124th General Assembly in part to allow a county budget commission to waive the requirement that a taxing authority adopt a tax budget for a political subdivision or other taxing unit, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 5705.281.

Ohio Revised Code Section 5705.281

Under the amended version of this section pursuant to HB 129, a county budget commission, by an affirmative vote of a majority of the commission, including an affirmative vote by the county auditor, may waive the tax budget for any subdivision or other taxing unit. However, the commission may require the taxing authority to provide any information needed by the commission to perform its duties, including the division of the tax rates as provided under ORC Section 5705.04.

County Budget Commission Duties

The county budget commission must still certify tax rates to each subdivision or other taxing unit, by March 1 for school districts and by September 1 for all other taxing authorities under ORC Section 5705.35, even when a tax budget is waived. Also, the commission is still required to issue an official certificate of estimated resources under ORC Section 5705.35 and amended official certificates of estimated resources under ORC Section 5705.36.

Therefore, when a budget commission is setting tax rates based on a taxing unit's need, for purposes of ORC Sections 5705.32, 5705.34, and 5705.341, its determination must be based on that other information the commission asked the taxing authority to provide under ORC Section 5705.281; when the tax budget was waived. Also, an official certificate must be based on that other information the commission asked the taxing authority to provide.

County Budget Commission Action

On October 11, 2002 during the Cuyahoga County Budget Commission meeting, the commission with an affirmative vote of all members waived the requirement for taxing authorities of subdivisions or other taxing units (Including Schools) to adopt a tax budget as provided under ORC Section 5705.281,

Alternative Tax Budget Information Filing Deadline

For all political subdivisions excluding school districts, the fiscal officer must file one copy of this document with the County Fiscal Officer on or before July 20th. For school districts the fiscal officer must file one copy of this document with the County Fiscal Officer on or before January 20th.

GUIDELINES FOR COMPLETING THE ALTERNATIVE TAX BUDGET INFORMATION

SCHEDULE 1

The general purpose of schedule 1 is to meet the requirement of Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 5705.04 which requires the taxing authority of each subdivision to divide the taxes levied into seperate levies. For help use the schedule B issued by the budget commission for the current year and add any new levies.

In column 1 list only those individual funds which are requesting general property tax revenue. In column 2 purpose refers to the following terms, inside, current expenses, and special levy for example. In column 4 levy type refers to renewal, additional, and replacement for example. In column 9 identify the amount of general property tax you wish to request.

NOTE:

The general purpose of column 9 is to demonstrate the need to produce property tax revenues to cover the estimated expenditures for the budget year. ORC Section 5705.341 states in part;

"Nothing in this section or any section of the ORC shall permit or require the levying of any rate of taxation, whether within the 10 mill limitation or whether the levy has been approved by the electors, the political subdivision or the charter of a municipal corporation in excess of such 10 mill limitation, unless such rate of taxation for the ensuing fiscal year is clearly required by a budget properly and lawfully, adopted under this chapter or by other information required per ORC 5705.281."

Property tax revenue includes real estate taxes, personal property taxes, homestead and rollback.

SCHEDULE 2

The general purpose of schedule 2 is to produce an Official Certificate of Estimated Resources for all funds. In column 3, total estimated receipts should include all revenues plus transfers in. All taxing authorities, except school districts, must submit a list of all tax transfers.

SCHEDULE 3

The general purpose of schedule 3 is to provide inside/charter millage for debt service. The basic security for payment of general obligation debt is the requirement of the levy of ad valorem property taxes within the 10 mill limitation imposed by Ohio law. Ohio law requires a levy and collection of ad valorem property tax to pay debt service on general obligation debt as it becomes due, unless that debt service is paid from other sources.

SCHEDULE 4

The general purpose of schedule 4 is to provide for the proper amount of millage to cover debt service requirements on voted bond issues. Major capital improvement projects are sometimes financed through the use of voted bonds. The taxing authority seeks voter approval of general obligation bonds and of the levy of property taxes outside the indirect debt limitation in whatever amount is necessary to pay debt service on those bonds.

SCHEDULE 5

The general purpose of schedule 5 is to properly account for tax anticipation notes. See schedule 5 for more details.

WHEREAS, the City has advertised and received bids for improvements to various streets in the City of Strongsville in connection with the Pavement Reconstruction Program for 2014; and

WHEREAS, Council is desirous of proceeding to award and enter into a contract for such improvements.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That this Council hereby finds and determines that the bid submitted by KONSTRUCTION KING, INC., for improvements to various streets in the City of Strongsville, in connection with the Pavement Reconstruction Program for 2014, meets the specifications on file in the office of the City Engineer; is in compliance with the applicable requirements for bids and contracts established by the laws of the City and the State; and is the lowest and best bid for the proposed contract. Consistent with provisions in the Bid Documents, the Council further finds and determines that any and all minor defects or informalities in the bidding process are waived, including but not limited to the lowest and best bidder's failure to timely execute a Prevailing Wage Certification with the original bid documents. All other bids for this contract are hereby rejected.

Section 2. That accordingly the Mayor be and is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with the aforesaid lowest and best bidder in an amount not to exceed \$805,945.00 for improvements to various streets in the City of Strongsville, in connection with the Pavement Reconstruction Program for 2014, and in a form approved by the Law Director.

ORDINANCE NO. 2014 – <u>117</u>

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, RATIFYING AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT AND MAKE PAYMENTS FOR VARIOUS EMERGENCY CLEANING, MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS TO CERTAIN CITY STORM SEWERS, DRAINAGE FACILITIES AND APPURTENANCES, WITHOUT PUBLIC BIDDING; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on or about Monday, May 12, 2014, various unusual rainstorms and extreme weather conditions created emergency circumstances threatening the health, safety and welfare of certain of the City's residents and their properties; and

WHEREAS, in order to properly address such circumstances and notwithstanding the best efforts of the City's Department of Public Service, and Engineering Department, it has become necessary to enter into a contract for supplemental services to clean, maintain and/or repair certain City storm sewers, drainage facilities and appurtenances, whether located in the public right-of-way or in public easement areas, on an emergency basis, and as weather conditions have developed; and

WHEREAS, such actions have been and are undertaken only upon the approval and recommendations of the Mayor, Director of Public Service and City Engineer, and with an existing City contractor that can quickly mobilize resources, and which is totally responsive and proposes competitive and reasonable rates for such services; and

WHEREAS, it has and will become necessary to render payments for such emergency services on an on-going basis in order to facilitate additional services as they become required in order to clean up debris and conduct further maintenance and/or repairs as necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, BY UNANIMOUS AFFIRMATIVE VOTE:

Section 1. That this Council finds and determines, as set out in Article V, §5 of the Charter, that there is an immediate and present emergency in the operation of the Department of Public Service of the City of Strongsville, in that it has become immediately necessary to enter into a contract, without public bidding, with **LAKE**

COUNTY SEWER CO., INC., for various supplemental cleaning, maintenance and/or repair services to certain City storm sewers, drainage facilities and appurtenances, either within the public right-of-way or otherwise primarily on designated public easements, due to the severity of recent weather, in order to provide for the operation of the Service Department and Engineering Department and the proper maintenance of the City storm sewers, drainage facilities and appurtenances of the public storm sewer system within the City, to protect the health, safety, welfare and property of the residents, and to conserve public funds.

- **Section 2.** That, for the reasons aforesaid, this Council hereby approves, ratifies and authorizes the Mayor proceeding with such emergency repair work necessary under the afore-described circumstances, and entering into a contract with LAKE COUNTY SEWER CO., INC., without public bidding, in a total amount not to exceed \$100,000.00, for the supplemental cleaning, maintenance and repair services to certain City storm sewers, drainage facilities and appurtenances within the City, at the rates of compensation for services reflected in the price proposal attached as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference and which is approved.
- That the funds for the purposes of this Ordinance have been appropriated and shall be paid from the Drainage Levy Fund, General Capital Improvement Fund and General Fund.
- Section 4. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 5. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to approve, authorize and ratify the contract for payment of emergency work in order to provide for the continuity of services, operation, and maintenance of the City's Department of Public Service and Engineering Department, to properly maintain City storm sewers, drainage facilities and appurtenances, to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents, and to conserve public funds. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the unanimous vote of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 1 AND REPEALING SECTION 2 OF ORDINANCE NO. 2014-094 WITH REGARD TO THE EMS INFORMATION SYSTEM UTILIZED BY THE CITY'S FIRE DEPARTMENT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, on May 5, 2014, this Council adopted Ordinance No. 2014-094 authorizing the Mayor to enter into a Community Benefit Donation Agreement with Southwest General Health Center and a Service Agreement with emsCharts, Inc., all with regard to procuring an EMS information system to be utilized by the City's Fire Department, and accepting Southwest's donation of certain costs associated therefor; and

WHEREAS, the Donation Agreement, including Exhibit A listing the donated items and approximate value, and which had included payment for annual fees for the emsCharts service, was executed and entered into, but the proposed Agreement with emsCharts, Inc. was not completed; and

WHEREAS, since then, the City's Chief of Fire has recommended that due to changed circumstances and for other various reasons, it would be preferable and in the City's best interest to reinstate and renew its existing contractual relationship with Zoll Data Systems, Inc. for EMS information system services, and to cancel and repeal any authority for the City to transfer over to the emsCharts system; but at the same time, to nonetheless continue to accept certain of the other donated equipment items from Southwest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

- **Section 1.** That Section 1 of Ordinance No. 2014-094 and Exhibit A of Exhibit 1 attached thereto are hereby amended by substituting a new, more limited Exhibit A, copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- **Section 2.** That Section 2 of Ordinance No. 2014-094 is hereby repealed in its entirety.
- **Section 3.** That any funds necessary beyond the donation to the City for the purposes of this Ordinance have been appropriated and shall be paid from the Emergency Vehicle Fund.

AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING SECTION 822.03 OF CHAPTER 822 OF TITLE TWO OF PART EIGHT OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE REGARDING REGULATION OF HOME SALES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 822.03 of Chapter 822 of Title Two of Part Eight of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Strongsville be and is hereby amended in order that it shall read in its entirety as follows:

822.03 PERMIT REQUIRED; COMPLIANCE; MAXIMUM NUMBER OF SALES; PERMITTED LENGTH OF SALE.

- (a) No person shall conduct a home sale within a Residential Zoning District or in or upon a residential use in any other zoning district in the City without first obtaining a permit from the Commissioner of Buildings.
- (b) No person who has obtained a permit shall violate any of the provisions of this Chapter.
- (c) No home sale shall be conducted by the same resident or a member of the family of such resident on such resident's property or on another resident's property more than twice each twelve month periodthree times within a calendar year.
- (d) No permitted home sale shall last more than three-four consecutive days.

Section 2. That all other Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith, including but not limited to the pertinent part of Ordinance No. 2014-096, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open

meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the City, and for the further reason that it is necessary to further simplify and facilitate the process for residents conducting certain types of sales at their homes, and to further establish resident-friendly regulations before the summer season for such sales. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
