ORDINANCE NO. 2015 – 025

**AN ORDINANCE APPROVING AND ADOPTING REPLACEMENT PAGES TO THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY FOR THE LAST HALF OF 2014, REPEALING ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS IN CONFLICT THEREWITH, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, in order to conform with the changes adopted by the Ohio General Assembly and with current State law as required by the Ohio Constitution, it is necessary for the City to amend certain provisions within its Traffic and General Offenses Codes; and

WHEREAS, various ordinances of a general and permanent nature have been passed by Council since July 21, 2014 and through December 31, 2014, which now should be included in the Codified Ordinances; and

WHEREAS, Council has heretofore entered into a contract with the Walter H. Drane Company to prepare and publish the aforesaid amendments and revisions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO:

**Section 1.** That the additions and amendments to the Traffic and General Offenses Codes of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Strongsville, as prepared by the Walter H. Drane Company in order to comply with current State law, be and are hereby approved and adopted; and the ordinances of Strongsville of a general and permanent nature, as revised, re-codified, rearranged and consolidated into component codes, titles, chapters and sections within the replacement pages to the Codified Ordinances for the last half of 2014, be and are hereby approved and adopted, all as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

**Section 2.** That any other ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with any of the above Ordinances shall, to the extent of any conflict, be and are hereby repealed.

**Section 3.** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its

committees, that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements.

**Section 4.** That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City; and for the further reason that there exists an imperative necessity for the earliest publication and distribution of the aforesaid amendments to the Codified Ordinances to the officials and residents of the City, so as to facilitate the administration and daily operation of the City and its departments, and to avoid practical and legal entanglements. Therefore, provided this Ordinance receives the affirmative vote of two-thirds of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor; otherwise from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

438.18 Focus and Aim of Headlights. (Adds subsection (b) requiring the headlights on a motor vehicle to comply with federal motor vehicle safety standards.)

### General Offenses Code

606.12 Failure to Report a Crime, Injury or Knowledge of Death. (Expands the listing of professional persons enumerated in Section 525.05(f)(1) and (g)(1).)

636.04 Aggravated Menacing. (Adds words or conduct directed at another person that refer to an organization to which the person belongs.)

636.041 Menacing by Stalking. (Adds words or conduct directed at another person that refer to an organization to which the person belongs.)

636.05 Menacing. (Adds words or conduct directed at another person that refer to an organization to which the person belongs.)

642.01 Theft and Fraud Definitions. (Adds subsection (II) definition of "active duty service member".)

642.02 Petty Theft. (Adds "active duty service member or spouse" to subsection (b)(2).)

642.19 Securing Writings by Deception. (Adds "active duty service member or spouse" to subsection (b)(2).)

666.09 Soliciting. (Adds "who is eighteen years of age or older" to subsection (a) and adds new subsection (d).)

666.16 Unlawful Advertising of Massage. (Adds new section prohibiting the unlawful advertising of massage with the promise or suggestion of sexual activity.)
