A RESOLUTION REJECTING THE FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE FACT-FINDER IN REGARD TO A LABOR AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE AND THE FRATERNAL ORDER OF POLICE, LODGE 15 (RADIO DISPATCHERS UNIT), AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, representatives for the Fraternal Order of Police, Lodge 15, Radio Dispatchers Unit (hereinafter the "Employee Organization") and the City of Strongsville (hereinafter the "City") have engaged in collective bargaining in an attempt to reach a collective bargaining agreement with respect to the Radio Dispatchers Unit, between the Employee Organization and the City; and

WHEREAS, the Employee Organization and the City have submitted the unresolved issues to a fact-finder under Case No. 15-MED-09-0849; and

WHEREAS, the fact-finder has made findings and final recommendations as to the unresolved issues, dated September 14, 2016;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF STRONGSVILLE, COUNTY OF CUYAHOGA AND STATE OF OHIO, THREE-FIFTHS OF ITS MEMBERS CONCURRING:

- **Section 1.** That this Council hereby rejects the findings of fact and recommendations of the fact-finder, dated September 14, 2016, in Case No. 15-MED-09-0849.
- **Section 2.** That upon adoption of this Resolution, the Clerk of Council be and is hereby directed to certify the results of the vote on this Resolution, together with a certified copy thereof to the State Employment Relations Board and the Employee Organization within twenty-four (24) hours after the vote count.
- **Section 3.** That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council; and that all deliberations of this Council, and any of its committees, that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements.
- **Section 4.** That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health, safety and welfare of the City; and for the further reason that immediate certification of the

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results of the vote on this Resolution is required pursuant to law and to prevent the imposition of financially burdensome obligations upon the municipal General Fund. Therefore, provided this Resolution receives the affirmative vote of three-fifths of all members elected to Council, it shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.

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
